A Merry Christmas! = A Happy New Year!

A Merry Christmas equals a Happy New Year? In other words, a Merry Christmas will lead to a Happy New Year! Pastor Mike, what do you mean?

Just this: If you do Christmas *right*, you <u>WILL</u> have a happy new year in 2021.

I'm saying that if <u>Christmas</u>—the power of Christmas; the deep message of Christmas—that God has sent his salvation to turn your life completely around and right side up—if that truth gets through to you, and you receive God's gift of Christmas, 2021 will be a happy new year for you!



Christmas is about a breakthrough—like the breakthroughs we pray for at church: "break through my hardened heart and cluttered mind;

The promise of Christmas was announced centuries earlier through prophets like Isaiah:

Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you. For behold, darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the Lord will arise upon you, and his glory will be seen upon you. And nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your rising.

Lift up your eyes all around, and see; they all gather together, they come to you;

Your people shall all be righteous; they shall possess the land forever, the branch of my planting, the work of my hands, that I might be glorified.

The least one shall become a clan, and the smallest one a mighty nation;

I am the Lord; in its time I will hasten it.

—Isaiah 60:1-4, 21-22 (ESV)

Go back and read that again. And again—slowly. Let those promises sink in; they're as real for 2021 A.D. as they were for 573 B.C.! God hasn't changed; God's promises haven't changed. God hasn't forgotten; he doesn't have memory issues!

God wants YOU to experience the power of Christmas—but that power is meant for all year, not for a few weeks in the deep midwinter!

No matter what 2021 has in store for us—as individuals, as a church, as a nation—God's power is available to give us daily victories in living, loving, serving, and sharing the message of his hope and transforming grace!

Circumstances? They're just opportunities for God to show up and demonstrate that he's still *breaking* through in our world, just like he did that first Christmas in rural Bethlehem. God still sees, still notices, still acts, still saves!

So turn off CNN; turn off Fox. Open your Bible (and some other good books) this year, and hear the good news, the real news, instead of more fake news, manufactured to either manipulate you or make you fearful and hopeless! The angels told the shepherds, "Fear not!" God is still saying, "Fear not! I'm here; Emmanuel! I'm still speaking; I'm still healing, setting free, turning loose—breaking through!"

If your 2021 needs a breakthrough, celebrate Christmas in 2020! How?

"Come and worship, come and worship, worship Christ the newborn king!" Merry Christmas, and Happy New Year! —Pastor Mike

Dear friends,

Happy New Year!

A heartfelt thank you to all of you for your generous support of the Dinner Table ministry over this past year. Like everything else, it didn't look anything like we expected it to!

In January and February of this past year, we served meals inside the Presbyterian Church, and averaged 75-120 each month. We began serving Drive-Thru meals in the Presbyterian Church alley in March (because of Covid) and continued every month, on the fourth Tuesday through the end of the year. At our first Drive-Thru meal, we handed out 75 coupons for a Hardee's meal. We ran out...quickly! We recalculated for April and ordered sub sandwiches from Subway. We served 200. We ran out...quickly! So for May, we ramped up and ordered meals for 300. We ran out, but had \$5.00 gift certificates from Hy-Vee when we ran out of meals.

Since then, we have served a consistent 315-350 meals every month, at a cost of approximately \$2200. And we couldn't do it. Not without you! So, thank you and God bless you.

We have a terrific volunteer team which changes almost every month, and we especially appreciate the youth serving alongside us. They will tell you that even through the masks we wear, we can smile and say "Have a good day" or "Happy Thanksgiving" or "Merry Christmas" as we hand a meal through the car window. *A mask cannot stop a smile!*

So, as we look forward to the New Year, we trust God to lead us, guide us, and show us where we can best be His hands and feet in Windom. He is faithful, and He knows how He wants this Dinner Table to work! We just want to listen and obey!
