Instant Replay: Why Fathers Matter

We're moving quickly through summer; it's almost the 4th of July already. And thinking about our Independence Day ought to make us assess where we are as a nation in the year 2021.

That assessment might not be very positive or encouraging. If we're being honest, our nation seems to be in trouble. Crime in our major cities is growing; violent crimes in many large cities are off the charts, with many tragic stories of property destroyed, neighborhoods decimated, and lives lost, including the lives of too many children.



This is being blamed on racism by some, and the usual suspects seem to be ready to stoke those fires and label everyone based on the color of their skin, not the content of their character. Those who want to make "Critical Race Theory" a part of the public school's curriculum are getting a reality check from parents who are pushing back vociferously.

The Covid virus may finally be slowing down, but it has left plenty of casualties as well; some of those casualties caused not by the virus, but by lockdowns and other related decisions decided by health "experts" and government "leaders". If that seems like a snarky or critical judgment of those in charge, so be it—many Americans are now suspicious of how this whole pandemic was handled.

We saw the financial impact of lockdowns and closing so much of our economy; now we're experiencing the inflation that comes from printing lots of dollars from thin air to send out "stimulus" checks to try to fix our woes.

Finally, we're hearing of the impact on people's health beyond the virus itself. Many people missed their medical appointments, both for diagnosis and treatment. Children spending a year at home away from in person school became depressed. Suicide has skyrocketed across age groups, but especially among the young.

There is much more, but I'm pretty sure you're already depressed—or maybe even angry with me for this litany of woes. But as we approach July 4th, I think it's our moral duty to ask, "Where are we today? How are we doing? How do we move forward?"

On Father's Day my message focused on the truth that fathers matter. There are people a lot smarter than me who have diagnosed our nation's ills, and their prescription is simple; fix the family. The absence of a father in a home is costly for the family, for cultures and for nations.

Our culture has devalued men, fathers, fatherhood and intact families. We've learned that you can throw billions of dollars at domestic problems and social ills and not fix anything. Here's what God said about it in the last book of the Old Testament, Malachi:

Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the great and awesome day of the Lord comes.

And he will turn the hearts of fathers to their children and the hearts of children to their fathers, lest I come and strike the land with a decree of utter destruction. —*Malachi 4:5-6*

As we approach July 4th, my hope and prayer is that we move beyond political, economic and race focused "solutions" to our problems, and see our deep spiritual needs. We need to return to God's model for families, fatherhood and faith. Then we will begin to find healing for our personal lives, our nation, and our world. I pray that it will be so. Pastor Mike

in Windom, Jackson, Worthington, Pipestone and Luverne. Donations are always welcome; the funds provide services and safety to clients in our community.



Hope 4 Kids International is a nonprofit charity that provides support to children and their communities in a number of countries. This is done through child sponsorships, providing water wells, health support, education, and more. Clean water is the passport to their futures! To date, 788 wells have been drilled, and our congregation has been involved with funding a number of them. Girls often must be their family's water carriers, and if there is no nearby clean water, they are kept out of school to go get water out of necessity. When a clean water well is provided, the girls can go to school, and the community enjoys much better health. If you choose to support Hope 4 Kids' mission, please designate whether you would like it to be for wells, sponsorship, the Crisis Fund, where most needed, or the area of your choice.
