

Christmas Light

The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told. —Luke 2:20

Christmas is a reminder that there is light in spite of all this world's darkness. Better than that, as John 1:5 reads, "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it."

We need that hope in these days. Maybe there is enough light on the path for you personally. But if not—if you feel overwhelmed by darkness—dark thoughts, dark

circumstances, a dark season of life—remember that the light WILL overcome the darkness. That's Jesus'

promise.

It may take time; it will certainly take faith. But eventually—in God's perfect, redemptive time —the light will overcome the darkness, and that light, the light of Christ, will purify, sanctify, redeem, and cause righteousness to prevail. God will save, God will heal, God will make all things new, and God will reign in Christ, so that darkness can no longer touch you and me.

It may be hard to believe that—or patiently wait for that—when there is so much noise all around us—voices, headlines, tweets, posts—all magnifying the darkness and hopelessness.

We have to discipline ourselves to hear the still small voice; the voice of our Lord Jesus, the voice of Christmas. It is there. He is speaking. Jesus is calling, inviting us to hear and trust.

This anonymous story is a reminder that there is hope when we listen to the right voice:

Sometimes I just want to stop. Talk of Covid, protests, looting, brutality. I lose my way. I become convinced that this "new normal" is real life.

But then, I met an 87-year-old who talked of living through polio, diphtheria, Vietnam, protests, and yet, is still enchanted with life.

He seemed surprised when I said that 2021 must be especially challenging for him.

Looking me straight in the eyes, he said, "No. I learned a long time ago to not see the world through the printed headlines. I see the world through the people who surround me. I see the world with the realization that we love big. Therefore, I just choose to write my own headlines."

"Husband loves wife today."

"Family drops everything to come to Grandma's bedside."

He patted my hand. "Old man makes new friend."

His words collide with my worries, freeing them from the tether I had been holding tight. They float away. I am left with a renewed spirit.

My headline now reads:

"Woman overwhelmed by the spirit of kindness and the reminder that our capacity to love is never ending."


Weather Announcements


Festival of Trees

You can either drop off your gifts to be wrapped and stop by later to pick them up, or you can stay and have refreshments while you wait for your gifts to be wrapped.






Adult Advent Study being led by David Derickson!
