

Get In the Boat and Grab an Oar!

As we go forward into post-Covid life, we—the church—will need to try new things, reach people in new ways, use technology we haven't used before. There will be trial and error; we experience that now as we struggle weekly with Facebook Live for our Sunday morning worship service! But we will keep trying and learning and improving!

Whenever we are navigating new technology, or trying to "read" what's changing in the culture around us (so that we can apply the gospel to it in relevant, life-changing ways), we will make mistakes. We'll fall in the mud. Have embarrassing mishaps.



But we can't stop trying. We've been commissioned by Jesus himself to "Go, make disciples of all...baptizing... teaching...and behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:19-20). Jesus' commission hasn't changed. The message doesn't change.

But the methods change. While we're still sharing the same good news about Jesus today, we have to find relevant ways to share that truth. Methods don't look the same in the 21st century as they did in the 1st century!

Change is hard. It's uncomfortable. But we all do it...when necessary. I'm amazed as I watch people in their 80's—and even into their 90's—navigate cell phones, computers, and tablets. Why? So that they can stay in touch with their grandchildren (and even great-grandchildren)! And yet, often these same people will criticize change in the church (that could more effectively reach their grandchildren and great-grandchildren).

Others will stand back and criticize when church leaders try something different, and the results aren't spectacular. Or it outright bombs. The critics weren't willing to get in the boat and row, but they are perfectly happy to lob verbal rocks from the safety of the dry shore.

Teddy Roosevelt was one of our great presidents for many reasons. On April 23, 1910, he gave a speech at the Sorbonne in Paris, France. The speech was entitled "Citizenship in a Republic." Here's one of the most memorable quotes from it:

It is not the critic who counts; not the man who points out how the strong man stumbles, or where the doer of deeds could have done them better. The credit belongs to the man who is actually in the arena, whose face is marred by dust and sweat and blood; who strives valiantly; who errs, who comes short again and again, because there is no effort without error and short-coming; but who does actually strive to do the deeds; who knows great enthusiasms, the great devotions; who spends himself in a worthy cause; who at the best knows in the end the triumph of high achievement, and who at the worst, if he fails, at least fails while daring greatly, so that his place shall never be with those cold and timid souls who neither know victory nor defeat.

Roosevelt knew his share of critics. He went forward anyway! How will you live into this new season of life as we work to share the good news of Jesus in new ways? Will you get in the boat, grab a paddle and row? Or will you stand on the shore, grab and lob rocks, and complain?

Update on Cora!

February is heart month and **February 7-14th** is **Congenital Heart Defect** (CHD) Awareness week which is a special week for our heart warrior, Cora. Cora was born with Double Inlet Left Ventricle (DILV) amongst other heart defects and has overcome many obstacles in her 16 months of life. A year ago in February she had her 2nd heart surgery and was discharged a little over a week later only to be readmitted after spending 4 days at home. She then spent 6 weeks inpatient at Mayo in Rochester due to a complication called chylothorax. Once home, Cora has worked diligently with physical therapy and occupational therapy to hit her developmental milestones. She is now walking, saying a few words, eating some by mouth, and will hopefully be able to start weaning off her g-tube feeds soon. Most recently Cora had to wear a holter monitor for 48 hours due to a couple instances of low heart rate; however, her results came back as normal which we were thankful for. Cora is such a joy and a blessing. Although we know Cora will face more medical procedures and problems in the future we also know God will continue to guide us on this heart journey.

Easter Lilies & Flowers





The deadline to place orders with the church office is **Thursday**, **February 24th**.






