

**Ash Wednesday is the beginning of Lent**, and Lent is the season we prepare to celebrate Easter—Christ's resurrection and our resurrection! The foundational truth of the Christian faith!

Ash Wednesday focuses on *our mortality*; we are dust and to dust we will return. Without the promise of resurrection, that is a dark observation: life is short, then you die. But (and with God the 'but' is always huge!) Easter changes everything! Jesus said, "even though you die, yet you shall live" – and when Jesus says "live" he's not kidding!



He's got eternal, abundant, full living in mind! The kind of living we can barely dream of—and therefore hope for—right now.

Ash Wednesday reminds us of *our humanity*. As human beings we suffer, we hurt, we experience loss, we grieve. The times we're living through have been times of suffering, hurt, and loss. We've all experienced it, and we've all grieved because of it.

So, this Ash Wednesday service will be a little different. While we will still remember that we are creatures of dust, we will also remember that we are creatures experiencing a season of grief. Our focus will be on grieving what we have lost during these past two years.

Why? So that we can move forward. As we acknowledge our grief, accept our loss, and ask God's forgiveness—both for ourselves and for others—we will begin to let go, so that we can move forward. Mary grieved at the empty tomb, but then she saw Jesus, and the emptiness of the tomb took on new meaning. It became a symbol of hope instead of loss!

Can we do the same with the empty places in our lives? I invite you to join me for Ash Wednesday—so that we can grieve, and in our acknowledgement of our grief, begin to heal, and find hope in places that previously just looked empty!

I also want to invite you on a Lenten Journey through Proverbs. The wisdom of Proverbs has blessed generations of those who have meditated on its challenging, often radical, words. It is a wisdom that can strengthen you, build your character, and ground you in a drifting world.

We live in a world of noise: phones, computers, TV's radios; constantly spouting information at us, much of it bad information, or so trivial as to be "white noise" that keeps us from thinking clearly. Is it any wonder we see so little around us that seems intelligent, honest and wise?

Join with me in cancelling out the white noise of our culture by reading one chapter of Proverbs each day in the month of March. We will start on Tuesday, March 1<sup>st</sup>, reading the 1<sup>st</sup> chapter of Proverbs...and we will end on March 31<sup>st</sup> with chapter 31. Easy to remember, easy to do!

You can simply make this a personal devotional time, or, if you desire, you can take it a little further and make it a personal Bible study by slowing down and reading each day's chapter and making deeper observations about how to apply its wisdom to your life. Meditate on a few verses that speak to you. Take notes. Ask questions. Pray. Listen. God will speak!

I hope you'll join me in this journey through Proverbs! God will bless us all as we do this together! And you will gain a better perspective on life and be better equipped to navigate the turbulent times we're living through.




First UMC will have a booth at the Windom Farm and Home Show on March 5th from 9:00am to 2:30pm. Come check it out!









#### What a trio. What a Savior!
