

#### Are We "United Methodists"?

I know some of you may already be weary of talking about our relationship with the United Methodist Church (and whether to stay in the UMC or disaffiliate). However, I would rather *over* communicate (so that questions are answered and there is clarity) than *under* communicate (and have confusion – and even wrong information being shared and believed).

That is why on **Sunday, October 30<sup>th</sup>** and **Sunday, November 20<sup>th</sup>** we will have Townhall meetings after worship (we will also have one in January). This will be a time to share information, updates and what the future may look like – and to also answer your questions.

As part of discerning the future, we need to understand the present, and our assumptions about the UMC and who we are as "United Methodists". I want to break that down in two questions, and ask them in reverse order: "Are we *Methodists*?" and "Are we *United*?"

**Are we** *Methodists***?** If John Wesley (*the founder of Methodism*) visited Windom First UMC today, would he recognize us as *Methodists***?** Not likely. Really? Why? Several reasons, but one in particular:

A defining behavior of early Methodists was that they met weekly in small groups for spiritual growth, accountability, and encouragement. If you did not attend your weekly small group (called a "class" back then), you did not receive a ticket to attend worship on Sunday and receive Holy Communion! How many of us meet this standard? Not many! We're not very "methodical" in our spiritual behavior. This continued as a requirement of Methodists until the early 20<sup>th</sup> century (which was also the time when Methodism started to plateau in the U.S. Hmmm...)

Are we *United*? When the UMC was created in 1968 (through the merger of the *Evangelical United Brethren* and the *Methodist Episcopal* churches), many envisioned it as a "big tent" church, with room for a diversity of theology and practice. So from the get-go, we have not been "united" – far from it. In 1972, this became even more evident when the church adopted a new vision called "theological pluralism" – meaning that many interpretations of scripture and points of view would be welcome in the church.

This has created tension in the UMC that has only grown over the past 50-plus years of our existence. Today we have many clergy (and bishops) who no longer honor their covenant vows to uphold the doctrines and discipline of the church. This has become evident in a number of ways: diverse and non-traditional views about the Trinity; Jesus' virgin birth; his uniqueness as both God and man; and his sacrifice on the cross for salvation from human sin. Human sin and sin nature has been recast—and often rejected—as a necessary understanding of our situation and predicament (and therefore our need for a Savior and Christ's sacrificial and substitutionary death on the cross for all people).

Of course, these theological interpretations have practical implications, leading to acceptance of same-sex marriage and the ordination of pastors (and today a bishop) who are self-avowed, practicing homosexuals (including here in Minnesota). This is contrary to the Christian church's belief, teaching and practice in all times and in all places for the past 2,000 years.

So if we're concerned about being "United Methodists", we may need to rethink our priorities, and whether words mean anything! There is much more to say about these things, so I hope you will attend worship and the meetings we have scheduled.



\$15 for our program will purchase 5 blizzard meals for an older adult, or

\$15 will buy 4 meals for someone who cannot afford to contribute for their meals.

This is a unique project of Samaritan's Purse that delivers gift-filled shoe boxes to hurting children around the world. This simple hands-on mission project gives our entire church family, especially children, a tangible way to demonstrate the true meaning of Christmas—God's gift of His Son.

There is a drop off box in the sign-up area of the church lobby if you would like to donate items to be packed by our church

family on Saturday, November 12th. The age groups for giving are 2-4, 5-9, and 10-14. Items are needed for both boys and girls. Most things are accepted but the following items are not: Used or damaged items; war-related items; chocolate or food; out of date candy; fruit rolls or other fruit snacks; drink mixes (powdered or liquid); liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.
