

#Christmas #End Times

When people find out I'm a pastor, they have questions for me... and some of those questions come up repeatedly. I'm no longer surprised by most of them.

One of the most common questions is, "Do you think we're living in the end times?" They usually ask this along with a comment about a tragic or ominous current event—could this be a sign of "the end times" they wonder?

In almost 40 years of ministry, there have been numerous national or world events that have triggered this "end times" question. Every generation since the time of Jesus has been asking this question. Even the biblical writers, like Paul, were pretty sure they were living in "the last days" and that Jesus was coming soon to establish his kingdom.

Paul's letters have an urgency in them about living in such a way that you are ready for the return of Christ. In one of his letters, he had to reassure believers that their loved ones who had died recently would still have eternal life, so strong was their conviction that "Jesus is coming soon" (1 Thessalonians 4:13-18)! Then he admonishes them to remember "that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night" (1 Thess. 5.2). So be ready for "the end times"!

So be ready! But *how* can we be ready? Here's the good news: God has made a way for us to be ready! It's called Christmas—the coming of a Savior who has made the way straight and even before us. Christmas is God's gift to us so that we can be ready for "the end times" — no matter when they come.

But people *still* want to know—when will the end times come? Are we—am I—living in "the end times"?

And the answer for each one of us is, "Yes—you are living in the end times." Because your clock is ticking; your days are numbered; you will go the way of all flesh: "ashes to ashes, earth to earth, dust to dust". You are living in your own end times simply by being human. Death for all of us is inevitable. "On a long enough timeline, the survival rate for everyone drops to zero."

Christmas is God's gift to you because you are living in the end times. Jesus came because you are living in the end times.

Therefore, Christmas is not a once a year holiday, and sometime around New Year's Day we just pack Christmas up and put it back in boxes till next year. Christmas is one of two central events in history (the other being Easter and Jesus' bodily resurrection) that really does offer "peace, good will toward people". That's a daily need—a lifetime need. Don't put it back in the box.

In spite of your sin and my sin—in spite of our ambivalence toward God, God is not ambivalent toward us; God always pursues us, always reaches out with goodwill, always tries to "seek and save that which is lost". His mercy is unending and his grace truly is amazing!

Our interest in #End Times should lead us to embrace #Christmas. They go together. If you have anxiety, fear, worry—even numbness or despair, you can open God's Christmas gift of salvation in Jesus. Rest in him; trust him. In opening that gift, you open the way to a life that's ready for anything, even "the end times".


As we go to print, our church is not yet decorated for Christmas, but we say a big **Thank You** to all who always decorate our church so beautifully! We appreciate you!

A simple act of kindness.....

Years ago, llene's preacher noticed the family standing in front of him at a New Orleans convenience store did not have enough money to pay for their few items. He tapped the man on the shoulder and said, "You don't need to turn around, but please accept this money." The man took the money without ever seeing the preacher.

Nine years later, the pastor was invited to speak at a church in New Orleans. After the service, a man walked up to the preacher and shared this story about how he had come to faith in Christ: "Several years ago, my wife and our child were destitute. We had lost everything, had no jobs, no money and were living in our car. We also lost all hope, and agreed to a suicide pact, including our child. However, we decided to first give our son some food, so we drove to a convenience store to buy him some food and milk."

"While we were standing in line at the store, we realized that we did not have enough money to pay for these items, but a man behind us asked us to please take the money from his hand and not look at him. This man told us that 'Jesus loves you."

"We left the store, drove to our designated suicide site, and wept for hours. We couldn't go through with it, so we drove away. As we drove, we noticed a church with a sign out front which said, 'Jesus love you.' We went to that church the very next Sunday, and both my wife and I were saved that day."

He then told the pastor, "When you began speaking this morning, I knew immediately that you were the man who gave us that money." How did he know? The pastor was from South Africa and had a very distinct accent. He continued, "Your act of kindness was much more than a simple good deed. Three people are alive today because of it."

A gentle challenge: Maintain your spiritual antennae, remembering that God can multiply the smallest gift many times over.

During this season of giving people are sometimes looking at some special projects that they can make donations to. A couple of upcoming projects you may consider donating to are the roof repair project and the sound system upgrade. Thank you again for your generosity.






