

A Few February Pastor's Notes

Update on Disaffiliation – Our current survey results (as of January 25th):

79% - leave the UMC 21% - stay in the UMC

Administrative Council meets Feb. 1. Pray for wisdom for your church leadership. All of our polls/surveys have shown there is strong majority supporting disaffiliation from the UMC. There will be an announcement soon about a date to vote regarding disaffiliation.

Here's an <u>important truth</u> to remember: If Windom First UMC decides to disaffiliate—and become Windom First GMC (*or whatever name we select*)—<u>we will be no less Methodist than we've ever been</u>! We will simply be joining a new branch of Methodism that God will use in our generation to reach others for his kingdom.

As John Wesley said—and we will still be able to say— "The world is our parish!"

New Bishop to preach at Windom on Feb. 19th – the new Minnesota – Dakotas area Bishop, Lanette Plambeck, will join us for worship Sunday, February 19th. She will preach (at the 10:30 service) and will also offer a time for Q&A after worship.

Live Lightly this Life – While we were created for this world—and God created this world for us, to be our home—the bottom line is: *we are only visitors here*. As Moses wrote in **Psalm 90:10**, *"The years of our life are seventy, or even by reason of strength eighty; yet their span is but toil and trouble; they are soon gone and we fly away."* We know that those years are brief in light of the eternity we will enjoy with God in the new heaven and new earth—living a life without pain, tears, sickness, aging, evil or death!

They will receive their reward. Our responsibility is to do what we can to reach others for Christ and help them find salvation and new, meaningful, abundant life in him.

May we—Christ's body—not get distracted from that mission! No matter what direction our local church takes in the future, may we always be intentional and fruitful, serving our Lord and building his kingdom!



- Feb 26th—Jr. High Youth meets from 4:00-6:00pm, Sr. High Youth meets from 5:30-7:30



7 reasons every child should experience summer camp.

- Social Skills ~ At summer camp, children will be around other kids their age. This gives your child the opportunity to bond and make friends, teaching valuable social skills and creating what could be lasting relationships.
