October's devotional comes from Alane and my experiences on our way home from taking our daughter to the Culinary Institute of America in New York state.

it did not hit the ice cream spot that I was craving. On our way home we didn't take the most direct route, because we had one more sightseeing place in Kentucky we wanted to visit. As we were passing through a small town, I finally decided to stop at Dairy Queen to get my ice cream fix. We went through the drive-thru. and we waited for about 5 minutes before someone took my order. Then we had to literally wait 15-20 minutes before we were able to get to the pickup window. We then waited around 3 minutes for someone to come to the window to take my money. I said to the young guy, "Is there only one person working today?" The young man smiled back and said jokingly, "Yeah." He gave me back my card and closed the window. I waited about another 3-5 minutes. to get my small ice cream cone. Finally, I received my ice cream and I said, "Thank you." and drove off.

I'm a little embarrassed to say, I was a little aggravated at that point. We had to drive through the small town to turn off to get back on the next highway. We were about 40 minutes to an hour on the new highway when, suddenly Kentucky State Trooper's cars come blowing past us with sirens blaring. There was one right after another. 


Directed awkwardly
