



Jesus called out with a loud voice, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." Luke 23:46

## I. The Proof of Purification (Luke 23:44,45)

- A. The darkness represents the sin of the world coming upon Jesus
- B. The next miracle happened The veil is torn in two!
  - 1. The Temple is designed with a "holy of holies"
  - 2. In front of that "room" is a large veil or curtain 60 ft. high X 4 in. thick
  - 3. The curtain separated God's presence from all humanity except the sanctified priest
- C. So what does it mean that the curtain is torn "From top to bottom" (Matt. 27:51)
  - 1. God tore it from heaven not man from earth!
  - 2. God decided that the atonement of Christ's blood was sufficient (Heb. 10:19 23)
  - 3. God can meet man anywhere anytime Man is free to come to God's throne! (Heb. 4:16)
  - 4. The temple represented the "old covenant" but now Jesus' blood becomes the "new covenant"

## II. The Prayer of Peace and Power (Luke 23:46)

- A. The prayer of a child = the prayer of peace (Psalm 31:5)
- B. Jesus uses the word "Father" once again a prayer of sonship
- C. Jesus states two powerful truths in this powerful prayer:
  - 1. He is ready to die in peace with God His Father
    - a. Simple truth Everyman has to face death
    - b. Powerful truth There is no fear with peace with God as your Father
    - c. Another powerful truth The fear of death will steal away your life!
  - 2. He trust God with His spirit
    - a. The word commit = *paratithemi* = to make deposit based on one's trust
    - b. The ultimate submission to God is to release our lives and spirits to Him (I Pet. 4:19; Acts 7:59)
- D. This is a power prayer against anxiety, fear, or pain –

## "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit"

## III. The Problem of Free Will (Luke 23:47 – 49)

A. We all have to decide how we will respond to Jesus and His invitation on the cross! B. Three responses:

- 1. The Centurion Praised God "Surely this was a righteous man" inspired
- 2. The People beat their breast and went away disgust
- 3. The Disciples Stood back and watched and wondered expectant
- C. How do you respond to Jesus' invitation on the cross?
