

The purpose of the meeting was to vote on replacing the heating and air conditioning systems in the church.

Vice President, Cheryl Denker, called the meeting to order in place of President, Greg Johnson. Mona Tanksley read a portion of the June regular church council meeting where a motion was made and carried to accept the bid from Olson Heating and Plumbing to replace and heating and cooling systems and to take money from the parsonage fund to pay for the project and repay the amount borrowed using funds from the Outreach fund over a five year period. Cheryl Denker then presented additional information regarding the project explaining the system and what is included in the bid of \$30,000 noting that the project will commence in September. There was some discussion regarding cleaning of the present ductwork noting this is included in the bid.

A motion was made by Ed Anderson, seconded by Darrel Denker that we accept the bid as presented from Olson Plumbing and Heating to replace the furnaces and air conditioners.

The vote was by showing of hands and the motion was carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:45 a.m.

The church council met August 1, 2016 at 7:30 pm. In attendance were Greg Johnson, Carole Johnson, Jim Pelan, Rachel Wise, Cheryl Denker, Carl Magnusson, Sandy Husar, Sam Schmidt and Mona Tanksley. Also in attendance was Pastor Eldal. Absent were Jon Seagren, Karl Lundquist and Kylie Penke.

The meeting opened with devotions given by Sandy Husar. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. Karen Blanc entered the meeting and discussed with the group her offer to purchase Bibles to have available in the pews as well as hymnals which would expand our music selections. After discussion a motion was made by Rachel to accept the donation of Bibles to place in the pews and to have Pastor work with the donor to decide on which version to purchase. Motion was seconded and carried. It was decided to have Karen get a couple of the hymnals to have for the Worship Committee to review before deciding on whether to purchase more of them. There was no treasurer's report available to review.

Pastor presented his reports for June and July. He also reported that he will be on vacation from August 9-26. Curt Hineline will fill in on Saturday nights and Mike Blanc and Gary Fugman will cover on Sundays.

Old Business: Greg thanked Cheryl Denker for presiding at the July 17 special congregational meeting in his absence. While discussing the heating/air conditioning project, it was decided to have Clay Olson check out the heating situation in the secretary's office to see if there can be improved regulation of temperature in that room. Sandy Husar reported that Gerald Groene will provide rolls for Sunday morning coffee hour on the second and fourth Sundays while Julie Johnson will provide for the other Sundays. Kylie Penke has indicated that she wishes to resign from the church council due to scheduling concerns though she wishes to remain on the Evangelism Committee. Greg will work on finding a replacement to fill out her term. Mona reported that she has checked on the price and brand of an AED and found that the cost would be in the \$2000 range. There was more discussion on the listening devices that are being considered to purchase. Greg explained how the system would work and the approximate cost of between \$1700 and \$1800.

Jim reported for the <u>Property Committee</u> discussing possible options for the window well coverings and he will continue to look for solutions. The screen will be replaced in the upstairs Sunday school room. Jim will also look into replacing the southwest door downstairs. It was reported that the white altar cloth has been cleaned. There was discussion about the need for a fire proof cabinet to use for storage of church records. Sam agreed to research what is available that suit our needs.

The Evangelism Committee will soon post a calendar listing youth activities where volunteers can sign up to help with meals, etc. Extra adult support would be appreciated to help with the youth activities. Nancy Johnson has worked with organizing the faith milestones that will be incorporated into the curriculum for all of our young people. The Sunday School round-up will kick off the new year on September 11. A praise service is scheduled for August 14 and we will try to keep that service the second Sunday of the month. We will utilize the youth and Sunday school children in this service.

After discussion, a motion was made by Carole to present a gift card to Gerald and Judy Groene to thank them for the years of providing rolls for the Sunday morning coffee. Motion seconded by Cheryl and carried.

The next meeting will be Tuesday, September 6 at 7:00 p.m.
