

First Evangelical Lutheran Church Annual Meeting January 27, 2019

The annual meeting of the congregation of First Evangelical Lutheran Church was held January 27, 2019. President Nathan Anderson called the meeting to order at 10:51 a.m. noting that a quorum was met with 66 members in attendance. Pastor Eldal then gave the devotions.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read, and a motion was made by Dan Tanksley to approve them. Motion seconded by Patty Miller and carried.

The report of the nominating committee was given by Darrell Denker who reported that three candidates have agreed to be on the ballot for church council to fill three vacancies. Candidates are Kathy Pearson, Brad Bousquet and Clendon Rost. Outgoing members are Sandy Husar, Carole Johnson, Jim Pelan and Karl Lundquist. The Outreach Committee has two members with terms expiring, Melinda Johnson and Clare Wiltse. Two candidates have agreed to run, returning member Melinda Johnson and Dr. James Unwin. There we no nominations from the floor for either the church council or the Outreach Committee. Jon Seagren called for a motion to cease nominations. Motion seconded by Darrell Denker and the motion carried. Vote was taken and all nominated candidates were unanimously elected.

The report of the auditing committee was given by Jim Pelan who reported that all was found to be in good order. A motion was made by Sam Schmidt and seconded by Cheryl Denker to approve this report. Motion carried.

For the committee reports, Nathan made an opening comment that all reports were provided in the annual report and could be reviewed therein.

Reports addressed in session:

- 1. The Outreach Committee report was given by Clare Wiltse. He noted that 2 categories had been eliminated and two added. Categories eliminated were LCMC Seminarian and Debt Relief and Wednesday Night Youth Program. Categories added were Pay It Forward and First Evangelical Lutheran Scholarship Fund. Category percentages for dispersion are listed in the annual report.
- 2. The Financial Secretary and Treasurer's Report was given by Audrey Unwin who reviewed both reports as printed in the annual report. There were no questions on either report.
- 3. The Property Committee report was addressed by Jim Pelan who made verbal additions to his printed report. Jim noted that the lights in the parking lot were upgraded to LED lights, an additional return air vent was added to the basement AC unit to provide adequate return air and a safety railing was installed in the basement for the access ramp to the elevator. Jim offered thanks to Nathan Anderson for his coordination work and to Anderson & Sons and Bill Ahrens for their work on the project.

Old Business: No old business discussed.

New Business: Mission/Benevolence - It was reported that the church council has recommended that \$12,000 be equally divided between the LCMC, Oakland Ministerial Association, Oakland Food Bank, Dr. Stuart Embury and Lutheran Family Services. A motion was made by Darrel Denker, seconded by Jon Seagren to distribute the money as recommended by the board. Motion carried.

The 2019 budget was reviewed and explained that adjustments were made based off the prior year's expenses. After discussion, a motion was made by Jim Pelan, seconded by Dan Tanksley to approve the budget. Motion carried.

Nathan stated that a committee would be formed to review the constitution and make recommendations for revisions that would update the constitution.

New business was concluded followed by an offering taken to support the ministry of Dr. Stuart Embury.

Prior to concluding the meeting, Nathan thanked the outgoing members of the council and Outreach committee for their service.

Nathan called for any final comments from the floor. Jill Johnson addressed the deteriorating condition of the church marque. Nathan thanked Jill for her work with the marque and tabled discussion pending action by the church council.

There being no further business, a motion was made by Rick Mulder to adjourn the meeting. Motion seconded by Joh Seagren and carried.

There will be an organizational meeting of the new council following lunch. The meeting adjourned at 11:24 with all saying the Lord's Prayer and Pastor giving the table blessing.


