## UNPLUGGED SUNDAY

Tradition is not always a bad or negative word as we often hear in its description. Tradition can be defined as a belief shared, observed, and practiced by one generation from another generation. Based on this definition, **all tradition is not bad or negative because some beliefs shared, observed, and practiced are good**.

Even though we have a good and comfortable way that we worship, sometimes we need to “unplug” and experience God in other valid and acceptable ways. In 2020, we began the year at St. John having Unplugged Sundays on 4<sup>th</sup> Sundays which were a great success, but the pandemic caused us to suspend them. **Unplugged Sundays are primarily designed to reach young people** which we believe is necessary since a lot of young people need to be reached for Christ.

Despite this current pandemic, Unplugged Sunday is scheduled to be reinvigorated this coming Sunday, January 23, 2022. Unlike two years ago, this forthcoming Unplugged Sunday will be virtual. **Our special guest will be a young preacher, Minister Kevin Craddock, and our special feature will be CHRISTalk—an unscripted conversation with Christian young people**. As the pastor, I am very

excited about this, and I encourage each of us to participate via YouTube on Sunday at 11:00 a.m. or thereafter. I envision thousands of viewers which is feasible if we view it and inspire many others to view it. I assure you that you will not be disappointed.

## **TITHING BEGAN BEFORE THE LAW**

The Bible explains that tithing is an important part of faith for those who follow God and that tithing (10 % of our gross income/increase) should be money we set aside before paying anything else. Nonetheless, many argue that tithing was a command and practice of the Old Testament law, but they do not know that tithing began before the Biblical days of the law. For instance, tithing has its roots in the Biblical account of Abraham presenting a tenth of the war spoils to Melchizedek, the king of Salem (Gen. 14:17-20). Abraham's tithe presentation to Melchizedek was before the law was ever written. Thus, let us not be guilty of incorrectly saying that we do not tithe because this was a requirement for only those in the days of the law. Tithing was practiced before the law, and it was still practiced in the New Testament. As I discussed a week ago, Jesus endorsed tithing in Matthew 23:23. If Jesus, who came not to change the law but to fulfill it, was opposed, he would not have endorsed tithing.

When we tithe faithfully, God promised to bless us abundantly (Mal. 3:10). Even though we are not assembling together for a short period of time, let us be faithful to God with our Tithes and Offerings as God is faithful to us with His manifold blessings. We currently give in person during Sunday Morning Worship Celebrations, by mailing or dropping off our Tithes and Offerings at our Administration Building or South Campus, or by giving online through our website ([sjmbc.org](http://sjmbc.org)).
