HOW TO REGAIN GOD'S FAVOR Exodus 15:26

"And said, If thou wilt diligently hearken to the voice of the LORD thy God, and wilt do that which is right in his sight, and wilt give ear to his commandments, and keep all his statutes, I will put none of these diseases upon thee, which I have brought upon the Egyptians: for I am the LORD that healeth thee."

When believers live with unconfessed sin in our lives, <u>we lose favor with God</u>. Having favor with people can be good, but having favor with God is more than good because this is life at its best. Praise God that we can regain His favor if we listen carefully to His voice, do what is right in His sight, be attentive to His commands, and keep all His statutes. In the case of the Israelites, God promised <u>not</u> to afflict them with the diseases that He brought upon the Egyptians. Moreover, when we have God's favor, we can experience His healing power because God said: "I am the Lord that heals you."

My beloved, we need to regain God's favor, and we learn about one of the ways to do this in Exodus 15:26. Although many are experiencing illness due to Covid 19, people can live without dying by regaining God's favor who said: "I am the Lord that healeth thee."

TITHING ENABLES BELIEVERS TO EXPERIENCE A HARVEST

We learn in the Bible that tithing is an important part of faith for those who follow God and that tithing (10 % of our gross income/increase) should be money we set aside before paying anything else. We have observed that Jesus endorsed tithing and that tithing began before the Mosaic law. Actually, tithing began about 1000 years before the law and before Israel was an established nation.

God promised to open the windows of heaven and bless believers so abundantly that we will not have the resources to contain all of our blessings. To prevent our foe (the devourer) from intercepting our blessings, God also promised to destroy the devourer. Malachi 3:11 reads: "And I will rebuke the devourer for your sakes, and he shall not destroy the fruits of your ground; neither shall your vine cast her fruit before the time in the field, saith the LORD of hosts." The word "devourer" in Hebrew means "seed eater." Note, a harvest cannot occur if the seed is eaten. Tithing makes the ground fertile for the seed which God promises to protect from the devourer whom God will destroy. In short, tithing enables believers to experience a harvest—abundant blessings!

Let us be faithful with our Tithes and Offerings unto the Lord, and I encourage those of you who are not doing so to experience abundant blessings in your lives by presenting faithfully your Tithes and Offerings unto the Lord.
