POSTURES TO AVOID Psalm 1:1 (KJV)

"Blessed is the man that <u>walketh</u> not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor <u>standeth</u> in the way of sinners, nor <u>sitteth</u> in the seat of the scornful."

The Book of Psalms begins by addressing our postures among unbelievers. Believers are blessed (happy) when our postures are correct, and the correct postures for believers are when we <u>walk</u> not in the counsel of the ungodly, when we <u>stand</u> not in the way of sinners, and when we <u>sit</u> not in the seat of the scornful. Walking in the counsel of the ungodly, standing in the way of sinners, and sitting in the seat of the scornful are postures we should avoid because they will hinder us from being blessed (happy). Basically, as believers, we must be mindful of how we conduct ourselves among people that are unsaved, and we must be on guard against being a stumbling block in their lives. Thus, my encouragement to each of us is to let the light of Jesus Christ shine through us consistently, especially when we walk, stand, or sit among unbelievers.

WORSHIP CELEBRATIONS

Our two in-person Worship Celebrations are on Sundays at 9:00 a.m. (the North Campus) and 11:00 a.m. (the South Campus). BLACK HISTORY MONTH

February is Black History Month. Black History is a significant part of American History which means that it is also a significant part of World History. Black people have contributed (and still do contribute) so much to our country's success; therefore, all of us have a responsibility to teach our children (and to teach others)

the facts about Black History which will help Black people appreciate being Black and other races of people appreciate Black people.

A MAJOR CONSEQUENCE OF ROBBING GOD

We learn in the Bible that tithing is an important part of faith for those who follow God and that tithing (10 % of our gross income/increase) should be money we set aside before paying anything else. We have observed that Jesus endorsed tithing and that <u>tithing began before the Mosaic law</u>. We have learned that <u>tithing enables</u> <u>believers to experience a harvest</u> (abundant blessings) and that <u>tithing empowers</u> <u>God's church to minister effectively</u>. Last week, we learned that <u>tithing is a step of</u> <u>faith</u>.

Today, we need to be aware of <u>the consequence of robbing God</u>. Some say that they cannot afford to tithe, but, as for me, I cannot afford <u>not</u> to tithe. Malachi **3:8-9** reads: "Will a man rob God? Yet ye have robbed me. But ye say, Wherein have we robbed thee? In tithes and offerings. Ye are cursed with a curse: for ye have robbed me, even this whole nation."

First, <u>how can one profess to be a believer yet rob God</u>? Most recognize that to rob anyone is immoral, so how can we describe a person who professes to be a believer that is robbing God? Believers rob God when we fail to present Him our tithes (10% of our gross income/increase) and offerings.

Secondly, <u>believers who rob God of tithes and offerings experience God's wrath</u> because they are "cursed with a curse" (meaning greatly cursed). They cannot secure what they gain when "cursed with a curse" because Haggai 1:6b says the bags which contain their gain are full of holes. This explains why some people cannot get ahead even if their income is greater than ever.

The consequence of robbing God is being "cursed with a curse" (greatly cursed). On the other hand, the consequence of obeying God by presenting Him our tithes and offerings is <u>abundant blessings</u> (Mal. 3:10). In summation, <u>the choice is ours</u>. Do we want to live "cursed with a curse" or abundantly blessed? As for me, <u>I</u> choose to live abundantly blessed by faithfully giving God my tithes and offerings. As a result, He has "opened for me the windows of heaven and poured out for me blessings that I have not room enough to receive them."

At St. John, we currently give in person during Sunday Morning Worship Celebrations, by <u>mailing or dropping off</u> our tithes and offerings at our Administration Building or South Campus, or by <u>giving online</u> through our website (<u>simbc.org</u>). Let's demonstrate our faith with our Tithes and Offerings.
