TRUSTING GOD FOR SAFETY Proverbs 29:25 (KJV)

"The fear of man bringeth a snare: but whoso putteth his trust in the LORD shall be safe."

The writer of Proverbs (whom many including me believe was Solomon) admonishes us about fear and encourages us to trust God. He says that "the fear of man bringeth a snare," and the word "snare" based on Hebrew studies suggests to be ensnared or trapped. It was a noose used for catching animals or a hook for the nose. Fearing anyone or anything just ensnares us to a situation that God did not design for our lives; instead, God wants us to be safe which is guaranteed for believers who trust in the Lord. Thus, as we live in these uncertain times, God wants us to trust Him at all times even in regards to safety.

WORSHIP CELEBRATIONS

Our two in-person Worship Celebrations are on Sundays at 9:00 a.m. (the North Campus) and 11:00 a.m. (the South Campus). Everyone (especially people who are elderly and physically disabled) is encouraged to arrive at least 10 minutes beforehand to be seated safely and comfortably. Temperatures are checked, hand sanitizing is urged, social distancing is applied regarding where people shall sit and walk, wearing a mask is requested, utilization of restrooms is restricted to 2-4 people at a time (depending on the size of the restroom), and congregating before and after Services is prohibited.

If you have any Covid symptoms (such as cold or flu) or if you have not completed at least 5 days of quarantine after testing positive, please view and participate in our online worship via YouTube rather than in-person worship along with many others who choose to worship with us through live streaming.

TITHING OFTEN REVEALS PEOPLE'S HEARTS

We learn in the Bible that tithing is an important part of faith for those who follow God and that tithing (10 % of our gross income/increase) should be money we set aside before paying anything else. We have observed that <u>Jesus endorsed tithing</u> and that <u>tithing began before the Mosaic law</u>. We have learned that <u>tithing enables</u> <u>believers to experience a harvest</u> (abundant blessings), that <u>tithing empowers</u> <u>God's church to minister effectively</u>, and that <u>tithing is a step of faith</u>. We have

also learned that people are "cursed with a curse" when they fail to tithe which is a consequence of robbing God and that tithing demonstrates our love for God.

Today, I am inclined to say that <u>tithing often reveals people's hearts</u>. Jesus said, "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also" (Mt. 6:21). Basically, people do what is in their heart to do. If tithing is not in one's heart, one will always make excuses for not tithing; however, if tithing is in one's heart, very little is capable of preventing one from tithing. My beloved, don't allow Satan to convince you that you cannot afford to tithe. If you have mismanaged your finances by not making tithing a priority in your budget, pray to get your finances in line with God's will. Rather than believing that you cannot afford to tithe, you should recognize that you cannot afford <u>not</u> to tithe.

At St. John, we currently give <u>in person</u> during Sunday Morning Worship Celebrations, by <u>mailing or dropping off</u> our tithes and offerings at our Administration Building or South Campus, or by <u>giving online</u> through our website (<u>simbc.org</u>). Let's demonstrate our faith with our Tithes and Offerings.
