

5 Simple Ways You Can Make This Lesson Stick With Your Kids

THIS WEEK'S LESSON: ROTTEN EGGS



IN THE CAR:

On the drive home, ask your child what he learned about this week's lesson: This week we talked about Judas, a "rotten egg" who was one of Jesus' disciples. Many people, like Judas, know a lot about Jesus, but don't accept him as Savior. If we want to stop making rotten decisions we have to accept Jesus into our hearts to change us.



HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Ask your kids if they think there is something Jesus can't forgive? If so/not why? Ask them if going to church is enough to stop them from making rotten choices? What's the only way to change our rotten choices?



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- What do you think Judas expected would happen when he betrayed Jesus?
- Why do you think Judas chose to betray Jesus?
- How do you think Jesus thought of Judas, even after he betrayed him?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

"Jesus said to her, 'I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies." - John 11:25 (NIV)



PARENT TIME:

What you need to know:

If your child has not yet accepted Christ as their Savior. Pray for them this week that God would be working in their heart.
