Dear friends,

Previously I mentioned that in 2019 we will be talking a lot about prayer and how we can begin moving forward to becoming known as a praying church.

One of the consistent themes in the New Testament's teaching about prayer is that we can be assured that God will hear and respond to our prayers. The apostle John points to this when he says, "This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us" (1 John 5:14 NIV). This is a wonderful message! It tells us that God knows our needs, and that God absolutely expects us to bring our needs to him through prayer.

An easy way to practice prayer is to follow the acronym "ACTS." It stands for Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, and Supplication.

A prayer of **Adoration** is a prayer that praises God's goodness and majesty. In the Bible, we find prayers of adoration in the Psalms. For instance, Psalm 111:1-4:

Praise the Lord! I will give thanks to the Lord with my whole heart, in the company of the upright, in the congregation. Great are the works of the Lord, studied by all who delight in them. Full of honor and majesty is his work, and his righteousness endures forever. He has gained renown by his wonderful deeds; the Lord is gracious and merciful.

A prayer of **Confession** is a searching prayer of the heart. When we confess, we bare our souls before God about our sins and shortcomings. Since all sin is sin against God, we are called to confess our sins to God. A key part of the good news of Jesus is that repentance can bring forgiveness and new life. Indeed, the Bible assures us that sincere confession before God will be met with forgiveness. We see this in 1 John 1:9 which says, "If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us



from all unrighteousness" (NRSV). So prayers of confession ought to be a regular part of our spiritual lives, as we become transformed into the people God would have us be.

A prayer of **Thanksgiving** is a prayer that recognizes the good things God gives us and offers thanks for them: our lives, our health, our families, and our faith. The apostle Paul told us, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you" (1 Thess. 5:16–18 NRSV). A part of what it means to live faithfully is to live out of a deep sense of gratitude for all that God has done for us. Prayers of thanksgiving help us to do that.

A prayer of **Supplication** is a prayer that lifts up requests before God. Supplications are often divided between those requests we make for ourselves and those requests we make on behalf of other people. We can turn again to the apostle Paul, who told us in Philippians, "Do not worry about anything, but with prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God" (v. 4:6 NRSV). It is natural for us to ask God for the desires of our hearts, and we can be assured that God will answer our prayers. So, we feel the need to offer prayers on behalf of our family and friends, as well as those whose needs we know even if we do not know them personally. God does answer prayer, even if His answers to prayer are not always the answers we want Him to give!

Following the ACTS model of prayer is just one of several types of prayer we find in the Bible. In the months ahead we will explore other models of prayer. In the meantime please join me in praying the ACTS.

Resource Center

Newsletter

2019 has started out busy for the Resource Center. We are averaging 25 people a day in the food pantry. With the recent government shut down we are anticipating a greater need in our area. Clients were issued their SNAP benefits early and are not guaranteed anymore benefits until the government is up and running again. The West Ohio Food Bank has been diligent in keeping us informed of the impact the government shutdown may have. Most of the food we purchase through the West Ohio Food Bank comes from USDA. USDA has informed them that after January 31st they will no longer receive the funding to operate the food bank. This issue becomes two-fold for the Resource Center. We are anticipating a greater client need, the West Ohio Food Bank is not guaranteeing USDA food, and the Department of Job and Family Services will suspend our workers after February if the benefits for March are not released. We are asking that you say an extra prayer for the stability of the Resource Center.

On a happier note the All in Community re-entry Ministry is starting a program called Hope Letters. The purpose of HOPE Letters is to give hope through regular correspondence to men and women who are incarcerated. We agree to send two letters or cards each month for six months. Our letters offer encouragement, non-judgmental relationship, faith sharing, and mentoring. We will be having an informational meeting on Wednesday, February 27th at 6:00pm in the lounge. We hope to see you there.

Women's Emmaus is February 7th through the 10th. Jessie Roark will be sponsoring Tracey Howard.

The Northside Neighborhood Association meets on the 3rd Tuesday at 7pm at St. Mark's UMC.
