#### **3 REASONS FOR THE CORINTHIAN CHURCH'S LIBERTY**

• **BIBLE DOESN'T FORBID IT** <sup>1</sup> "We all possess knowledge" (v.1)

• AN IDOL IS NOTHING 4 "An idol is nothing at all in this world. . .there is no God but one" (v.4)

> • GOD ISN'T CONCERNED ABOUT WHAT WE EAT 8 "food does not bring us near to God;" (v.8)

### 4 THINGS LOVE CONSIDERS WHEN FACED WITH LIFE'S GRAY AREAS

### 1. Love asks: "How will this <u>affect</u> my Church family?"

<sup>1</sup> Now about food sacrificed to idols: "We know that we all possess knowledge." But knowledge puffs up while love builds up. <sup>2</sup> Those who think they know something do not yet know as they ought to know. <sup>3</sup> But whoever loves God is known by God. 1 Corinthians 8:1-3

## 2. Love says "I will limit my freedom if my actions <u>offend</u> my brothers or sisters."

<sup>4</sup> So then, about eating food sacrificed to idols: We know that "An idol is nothing at all in the world" and that "There is no God but one." <sup>5</sup> For even if there are so-called gods, whether in heaven or on earth (as indeed there are many "gods" and many "lords"), <sup>6</sup> yet for us there is but one God, the Father, from whom all things came and for whom we live; and there is but one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom all things came and through whom we live. <sup>7</sup> But not everyone possesses this knowledge. Some people are still so accustomed to idols that when they eat sacrificial food they think of it as having been sacrificed to a god, and since their conscience is weak, it is defiled. 1 Corinthians 8:4-7

# 3. Love says "I will limit my freedom if my actions lead my brother or sister to <u>violate</u>

<sup>8</sup> But food does not bring us near to God; we are no worse if we do not eat, and no better if we do. <sup>9</sup> Be careful, however, that the exercise of your rights does not become a stumbling block to the weak.

• **Proskomma (***pro's-kom-mä***)**:to stumble; to place an obstacle so to trip someone's feet; to strike against

<sup>10</sup> For if someone with a weak conscience sees you, with all your knowledge, eating in an idol's temple, won't that person be emboldened to eat what is sacrificed to idols? <sup>11</sup> So this weak brother or sister, for whom Christ died, is destroyed by your knowledge. 1 Corinthians 8:8-11

# 4. Love says "I will limit my freedom because I don't want to <u>sin against Christ</u>."

<sup>12</sup> When you sin against them in this way and wound their weak conscience, you sin against Christ. <sup>13</sup> Therefore, if what I eat causes my brother or sister to fall into sin, I will never eat meat again, so that I will not cause them to fall.
1 Corinthians 8:12-13

- 5. What "knowledge" and freedom that you currently enjoy would you be willing to give up in order to not destroy a weaker brother or sister?
- 6. How can the behavior of a mature believer challenge an immature believer to grow?
