## 1. Don't be <u>surprised</u> when you face opposition.

<sup>12</sup> Dear friends, do not be surprised at the fiery ordeal that has come on you to test you, as though something strange were happening to you. 1 Peter 4:12 <sup>17</sup> For it is time for judgement to begin with God's household; and if it begins with us, what will the outcome be for those who do not obey the gospel of God? 1 Peter 4:17

<sup>19</sup> So if you're suffering in a manner that pleases God, keep on doing what is right and trust your lives to the God who created you, for he will never fail you.

## 2. <u>Rejoice</u> in your suffering as partnership with Jesus.

<sup>13</sup> But rejoice inasmuch as you participate in the sufferings of Christ, so that you may be overjoyed when his glory is revealed. <sup>14</sup> If you are insulted because of the name of Christ, you are blessed, for the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you. <sup>15</sup> If you suffer, it should not be as a murderer or thief or any other kind of criminal, or even a meddler.
<sup>16</sup> However, if you suffer as a Christian, do not be ashamed, but praise God that you bear his name.
1 Peter 4:13-16

- 1. What was your "A-Ha" from Sunday's message? Why?

- 8. When Peter tells them to continue to do good (v.19), what reasons does he give for continuing.
