We Focus our Family Identity when we realize our parental responsibility is to gradually transfer our children's dependence upon us to dependence on God and interdependence with family.

4 NATURAL PHASES OF DEVELOPMENT

Phase 1: Discipline (Birth - 5 years)

Key Questions: "Am I safe?" "Am I able?"

Phase 2: <u>Training</u> (6 - 12 years)

Key Questions: "Do I have your attention?" "Do I have what it takes?"

Phase 3: <u>Coaching</u>

Key Questions: "Who likes me?" "Who do I like?" "Where do I belong?" "Why should I believe?"

Phase 4: Friendship

Key Questions: "How can I matter?" "What will I do?" "Who am I?"

WHEN FAMILY IDENTITY IS STRONG, PEER-PRESSURE IS WEAK. WHEN FAMILY IDENTITY IS WEAK, PEER-PRESSURE IS STRONG.

2 PRINCIPLES TO HELP FOCUS FAMILY IDENTITY

1. Love
