Word Study

In Hebrews 1:3 we are told that the Son is the "exact representation" of God's essence and thus is the perfect revealer. The Greek word for "exact representation" is the word "Charakter" (khä-räk-tā'r) and refers to the impress made by the engraving tool. This is its only occurrence in the New Testament (although charagma – derivative of character – appears 8xs). The idea is that as the imprint of the die perfectly represents the original design, so in Christ there is the display for those who have eyes to see of God's very essence. In a similar assertion, Paul, in Colossians 1:15, sets forth Christ as the "timeless image" (eikon) of God. Jesus Himself said "He that hath seen me hath seen the Father" (John 14:9).

In Romans 8:29, the Apostle Paul tells us that "those God foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the likeness of his Son. . . ." The Greek word for likeness is "eikon" – the timeless image, the exact representation. Just as Jesus perfectly revealed God, we are now to perfectly reflect God because we are to be the image of Christ.
