## **Communion Invites us to:**

## 1. Look <u>around</u> to make sure our church has relational unity.

<sup>17</sup> In the following directives I have no praise for you, for your meetings do more harm than good. <sup>18</sup> In the first place, I hear that when you come together as a church, there are divisions among you, and to some extent I believe it.

## ◆ Schisma (*skhē'-smä*): <u>Division; gap; split;difference</u> of opinion about a certain topic

<sup>19</sup> No doubt there have to be differences among you to show which of you have God's approval.

## ◆ Hairesis (*hī*'-*re-sēs*): <u>to choose an opinion; a group of</u> people who hold a certain opinion; a sect

#### WE SHOULD HAVE DIVERSITY IN OUR CHURCH, BUT OUR DIVERSITY SHOULD NOT CREATE DIVISION.

<sup>20</sup> So then, when you come together, it is not the Lord's Supper you eat,
<sup>21</sup> for when you are eating, some of you go ahead with your own private suppers. As a result, one person remains hungry and another person gets drunk.
<sup>22</sup> Don't you have homes to eat and drink in? Or do you despise the church of God by humiliating those who have nothing? What shall I say to you? Shall I praise you? Certainly not in this matter!

<sup>33</sup> So then, my brothers and sisters, when you gather to eat, you should all eat together. <sup>34</sup> Anyone who is hungry should eat something at home, so that when you meet together it may not result in judgment.

1 Corinthians 11:17-22, 33-34 (see also: John 17:22-23; Matthew 5:23-24)

## 2. We Look <u>back</u> to Remember what God did.

<sup>23</sup> For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, <sup>24</sup> and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me." <sup>25</sup> In the same way, after supper he took the

cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." 1 Corinthians 11:23-25 **3. We Look <u>forward</u> to Remember Jesus is Coming Again!** 

<sup>26</sup> For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. 1 Corinthians 11:26 (see also: Matthew 26:29; James 5:7-9)

# 4. We Look <u>inward</u> to Examine our Hearts to Prevent God's Judgment.

<sup>27</sup> So then, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. <sup>28</sup> Everyone ought to examine themselves before they eat of the bread and drink the cup.

#### ◆ Dokimazō (*do-kē-mä'-zō*): <u>to test;examine</u>, prove;scrutinize;rigorous self-examination

<sup>29</sup> For those who eat and drink without discerning the body of Christ eat and drink judgment on themselves. <sup>30</sup> That is why many among you are weak and sick, and a number of you have fallen asleep. <sup>31</sup> But if we were more discerning with regard to ourselves, we would not come under such judgment. <sup>32</sup> Nevertheless, when we are judged in this way by the Lord, we are being disciplined so that we will not be finally condemned with the world. 1 Corinthians 11:27-32
