There will be no Sunday School/Life Group meetings in the morning.

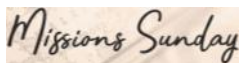

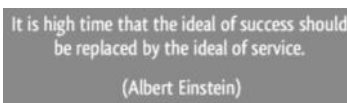

These funds are used for administrative expenses, leadership training, and promotional materials for district and local church groups. This office is completely supported by National WM Day offerings.

The WAG Harvesters' food distribution is scheduled for the 3rd Mon of each month.

Girls are given medical care, emotional support, spiritual guidance, and encouragement to complete their schooling. Young mothers may choose to keep their babies or place them through adoption. If the girl chooses adoption, foster homes care for the infants from birth until the adoptions are completed.
