## Six days before Passover John 12:1–2, 9, 12 The **first three words** of verse 12 " . . . . What is so important about these three words? A lamb, without blemish Exodus 12:3 and 6 • **choose** a \_\_\_\_-year-old lamb "without blemish" • bring it into their \_\_\_\_\_, and care for it for \_\_\_\_days. • On Nisan 14,3 they were to **slaughter** it just before sundown and put its blood on the lintel and doorposts of their home (Exodus 12:21-23; see also Leviticus 23:5; Numbers 9:2-5, 28:16; Joshua 5:10-11). That same night, the Lord would " - " every home he saw with the lamb's blood: Because a new Hebrew day begins at \_\_\_\_\_\_,<sup>4</sup> "that same night" would have been **Nisan 15**.5 It was on this date Israel left Egypt and passed through the \_\_\_\_\_-—the date God redeemed the Israelites out of slavery. Gentle and riding and on a donkey Six days before Passover puts Jesus in Bethany on Nisan 9 (Nisan 15 minus 6 days).6 "The next day" would have been Nisan 10—the same "date" the Israelites were to bring "\_\_\_\_\_ without blemish" into their homes.
