## Pastor's Corner

### Christ Is Our Sanctifier

The Christian & Missionary is a Christ-centered movement of God. The centrality of Jesus to our life and identity is expressed by our commitment to the proclamation of the Four-Fold Gospel. Christ is our Savior, Sanctifier, Healer, and Coming King. Today we will discuss Christ our Sanctifier.

The term sanctification means to set apart. It refers to the act of God that sets one apart from sin and to God. Each believer is in some sense set apart for God at the moment of salvation (1 Cor. 1:2). At the moment of salvation the believer is indwelt by the Holy Spirit, his or her heart is renewed and regenerated, and he or she becomes a new creation in Christ. This is initial sanctification.

This initial setting apart from sin and for God is normally followed by growth in grace. A new believer will probably recognize a new hunger for godly things. As she gives herself to spiritual pursuits, such as prayer, Bible reading, and fellowship with other believers she will experience a growth in godly character. But as one walks the path of discipleship it often becomes evident that there is still something within the believer that resists the changes that have been brought about by the new birth. A person may recognize that though she or he has received Christ as savior and is changing there remains a rebellion within the heart that causes a struggle with

sin and temptation and quite often the believer is unsuccessful in the struggle.

This struggle is caused by what the Bible calls carnality or "the flesh." It is what characterizes a life apart from the grace of God and it fights for a place in the believer's life (Galatians 5:16-17). This struggle can be crippling to the spiritual life and if yielded to will bring about a life that looks a lot like the one you lived before you were a Christian. Notice that Paul calls the Corinthian believers carnal and then describes their life as characterized by such things as envy, strife and division (1 Cor. 3:1-3). Most believers come to a point in their spiritual life when they recognize that although they have been born-again there remains this struggle with carnality and they have the potential to fall into sin.

This realization is a good thing because it may prompt a crisis in one's Christian life. There is a choice to be made. Will I allow carnality to influence or even dominate my spiritual life or will I turn to Christ and seek His help in the battle? The good news for one who is struggling is that there is victory to be had in this struggle. God has not left us powerless in the face of it. Romans 7 & 8 show us the way forward. Paul describes the struggle with carnality or the flesh in Romans 7. It quite often leads to defeat (7:13-20). This is not the normal Christian life. Romans 8 provides the solution to this struggle.

## Community Outreach

One important lesson I learned over Christmas is that God uses ordinary people to accomplish extraordinary things. The shepherds were as ordinary as they come. They had no great status. They had no special skills or qualifications. But they became unconventional evangelists, telling everyone of Christ's birth even though they didn't fully understand. They didn't have the whole story. They were only responsible to tell what they had seen and heard. God shows himself to people throughout the Scriptures. He doesn't ask for much- just to share with others what they had seen and heard. And just like in the scriptures, God is revealing himself to us. He is working in our lives. What are some of the extraordinary things you have witnessed? Not all miracles are Red Sea-parting sorts. But God is surely working. When God touches lives, how could anyone not respond by sharing what they have seen and heard? You don't have to know more than you know right now. God wants to use you today.

Coming in April: a new small group study series on how to generate spiritual conversations with friends and open the dialog to share how God is working in your life.

## Pastor's Corner continued

Verses 3-4 state: For what the law could not do in that it was weak through the flesh, God did by sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, on account of sin: He condemned sin in the flesh, that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us who do not walk according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. The death of Christ and the gift of the Spirit are God's solution. Romans 6:6 points out that the old way of life, that life of carnality was crucified with Christ so that the "body of sin" might be done away with. And the Holy Spirit is given so that we may have the power to overcome the flesh and live an obedient life to the glory of God. Read Romans 8 and notice how many times the Spirit is mentioned. Up until this point in Romans the Holy Spirit has been mentioned a handful of times. The Spirit-filled life is key to overcoming carnality.

Once one recognizes this struggle and the solution, it calls for action. We must first surrender our entire life and will to the Father (Romans 12:1-2). Then, because one recognizes that she or he is powerless to defeat carnality in one's life she must look to Christ. His death has affected the death of the old way of life. And His resurrection makes a new life possible. Therefore, an act of faith in Christ is called for as described by Paul in Galatians 2:20: I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me. In recognition that you are powerless to defeat carnality, call on Christ to fill you with His Spirit and cause you to walk in righteousness (Romans 8; esp. v. 4; Luke 11:9-13; Ezek 36:25-27). The Spirit-filled life is maintained and strengthened by abiding in Christ as described

in John 15:1-11. Maybe you have recognized your own struggle with sin. I encourage you to turn to Christ our Sanctifier. He is powerful enough and kind enough to give you the victory!
