Update on The Presbyterian Church of Charleroi Haitian Outreach Project

We recently received this update from Rev. Sharon Woomer at The Presbyterian Church of Charleroi about their outreach program to the Haitian immigrants working living and working in their community.

"Things are going extremely well here in Charleroi-

We have had (thanks to Gayle and her team from Child Evangelism Outreach leading VBS) a wonderful beginning with children's ministry- we started with 10 and had twenty children from midweek on!

Also last week we hosted a Mobile Medical Unit in our parking lot and also had an area set up so that community members could meet with service providers

We are in serious planning mode for a faith based afterschool program led by a very experienced neighbor from Haiti who is well acquainted with the community. I am recruiting volunteers.

We will have a small outreach dinner on Saturday (in July) (prepared by a college student from Ethiopia!) to welcome a new couple from Haiti (just here 2 weeks) worshipping with us.

We had our first giveaway of household goods - we had 8 long tables full of items- and a mattress and springs - and all the items were gone in 20 minutes! Our next one is planned for mid August. I'll be sending out notes to our churches inviting donations.

Also under discussion is the hosting of an ongoing series of small group discussions to support so many who are dealing with trauma.
