What is the chief end of man? It is to glorify God and enjoy Him forever!

C.S. Lewis said." I had never noticed that all enjoyment spontaneously overflows into praise unless (sometimes even if) shyness or the fear of boring others is deliberately brought in to check it. The world rings with praise — lovers praising their mistresses, readers their favorite poet, walkers praising the countryside, players praising their favorite game — praise of weather, wines, dishes, actors, motors, horses, colleges, countries, historical personages, children, flowers, mountains, rare stamps, rare beetles, even sometimes politicians or scholars...." He also said, "I had not noticed either that just as men spontaneously praise whatever they value, so they spontaneously urge us to join them in praising it: "Isn't she lovely? Wasn't it glorious? Don't you think that magnificent?" The Psalmists in telling everyone to praise God are doing what all men do when they speak of what they care about.

This month as a family, let us pay close attention to what we value most, which is often seen in what we praise. Let us ask the Lord always to help us find our greatest joy in what is of most value... the first and best of Beings.



BIG IDEA







SERMON NOTES PSALM 4

BIG IDEA

Joy and peace are hard to have when we are facing hurtful situations. Especially when those hurtful things are from others saying wrong things about us. King David experienced hateful lies against him. He can either defend himself or trust the Lord to expose the truth. In trusting the Lord, he is given much joy. Jesus does the same when he does not even address the lies told about him while he hangs on the cross. He knows that the truth will be clear as He endures the cross and is then raised.
