## “March Off the Map”

*“A man cannot discover new oceans until he has the courage to leave the shore.” – Unknown*

What an arresting quote that suggests that if anything new and exciting is going to happen in your life, then you have to be willing to take a risk and try new things. Go where you haven't gone before. Do things you have never done before. Read books you have never read before. And so on....

Taking a risk to try new things is problematic I know. We are used to the familiar. Whether that familiar is healthy or toxic, we trust it and know it nonetheless, and will stay in that space no matter what.

Imagine where the universal church would be without risk-takers. I mean, imagine for a minute if the disciples would have told Jesus “no” when he said to them, “Follow me and I will make you fishers of men.” Imagine if Moses would have looked at that burning bush in the eye and said, “no.” Imagine if Isaiah would have dared to see the glory of the LORD in the temple and still said “no, don't send me.” Imagine if Nehemiah heard the discouraging news about Jerusalem and never gave it another thought to leave his job and go back to Jerusalem to rebuild her walls. I could go on and on mentioning biblical character after biblical character and talk about all the risks those characters took to serve and glorify God.

Their witness reminds us that you cannot serve our great God without taking risks. Their witness reminds us that serving God is not convenient. It is not safe. It is not supposed to be the familiar. It is not supposed to become something we label as routine. Serving God is an adventure which suggests that there ought to be some uncertainty, some fear, some excitement, some faith, some perseverance, and some determination all rolled up into your discipleship dossier.

Risk-taking Mission and Service is about God telling us to march off the map of our finite version of Christianity and embrace the unknown for the sake of impacting lives. On several occasions, Jesus told his disciples, “We must go to the other side” referring to crossing the Sea of Galilee. What Jesus was also saying was that his disciples must never be afraid of crossing cultural, political, spiritual, economic, or social boundaries. In other words, His disciples must and should be risk-takers. Love for God and humanity has no boundaries. This love cannot be insular, parochial, or myopic. Agape (unconditional love) reaches inward, outward and upward. What Jesus was really saying was that the earth is the LORD's and the fullness thereof, the world, and they that dwell therein. As John Wesley put it: “The world is our parish.” The Rev. Dr. Halford Luccock said, “Are we fishers of men or just keepers of the aquarium?” We have to figure out what mindset we have. Is it an ocean mindset or an aquarium one? Have a great week.

# Morning Scripture

## *Joshua 4:1-11 (NKJV)*

<sup>1</sup> And it came to pass, when all the people had completely crossed over the Jordan, that the LORD spoke to Joshua, saying:

<sup>2</sup> ***“Take for yourselves twelve men from the people, one man from every tribe,***

<sup>3</sup> and command them, saying, ‘Take for yourselves twelve stones from here, out of the midst of the Jordan, from the place where the priests’ feet stood firm. You shall carry them over with you and leave them in the lodging place where you lodge tonight.’ ”

<sup>4</sup> ***Then Joshua called the twelve men whom he had appointed from the children of Israel, one man from every tribe;***

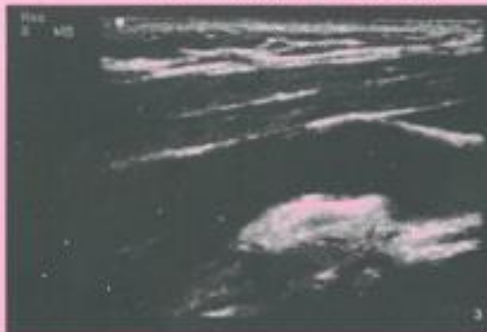

## hATTR Amyloidosis Overview

### What is hereditary ATTR (hATTR) amyloidosis?

hATTR amyloidosis is a rare, hereditary condition. Approximately **1 in 25 African Americans** have a certain **gene variant, or change within a gene, that may be associated with the development of hATTR amyloidosis.**

### What do I need to know?

- hATTR amyloidosis is passed down through families.
- Although anyone can be at risk for this disease, it is more common for people of certain ethnicities, such as those of African (West African: Ghana, Ivory Coast, Nigeria, and Sierra Leone, or Afro-Caribbean), Brazilian, Irish, and Portuguese descent.
- The disease may affect several parts of the body and make it difficult to walk. It can also cause digestive problems, numbness/tingling in the hands or feet, and/or heart failure. This is not a complete list of symptoms that may be experienced with hATTR amyloidosis.
- The symptoms can often be similar to those of other, more common conditions, such as alcoholic neuropathy, AA amyloidosis, AL amyloidosis, carpal tunnel syndrome, diabetic neuropathy, and hypertensive heart disease. It's important to talk to your doctor if you're experiencing symptoms.

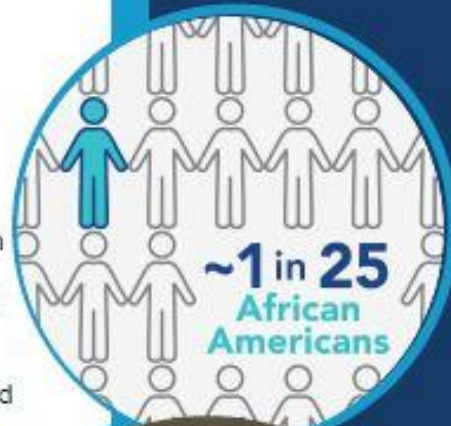

## Lessons from COVID-19 Will Lead to Long-Lived New Traditions in Houses of Worship

While many houses of worship have resumed limited capacity, in-person worship services and other activities since the outbreak last year and state-issued restrictions on social gatherings, I suspect that some lessons from the storm called COVID-19 will lead to long-lived new traditions. I also suspect that some longstanding previously unquestioned church traditions likely will be challenged whenever things do get back to some semblance of normal amid those changes necessitated to the church's change in program due to coronavirus.

Traditions, like, er um, all that hugging and greeting with a kiss. How about "turn to your neighbor and say...?" Will there still be the laying on of hands during prayer? And what about the belief that "salvation" is irrevocably tied to loyal church attendance? Especially in light of thousands upon thousands of Christians not going to church or attending only sparsely over the last year.

A believer that the biblical call of "not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together" is not a command to go to church but a command to be the church. A believer that, as Jesus said, "For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them." Some of my evangelically minded brothers and sisters have chided me over the years for my absence from the pews on Sundays, where they surmise every good Christian must be found. Except since the pandemic, many across American Christendom have found themselves as members of Zoom Temple or Morning Glory Facebook Live.

I gotta admit, I attend. And I dig it. Amen. Indeed many church leaders have turned to the internet as a vehicle of transmitting sermons, worship service and also connecting the body of believers. From where I sit, that's a good thing. In fact, the widespread use of the internet by churches big and small appears to be ushering in a new dispensation of technologically-based church worship and fellowship. The good news? Some of my pastoral friends report a spike in "Sunday service attendance" with hundreds or thousands additionally electronically tuning in. The Lord works in mysterious ways... Hallelujah!

# Little Known Black History Fact

## Fannie Jackson Coppin

The namesake of Baltimore, Maryland's Coppin State University, **Fanny Jackson Coppin**, was a woman of exceptional fortitude and ambition. Born into slavery, Coppin was the first Black woman to become a school principal and was driven by a need to spread education to newly freed slaves.

Fanny Marion Jackson was born in October 1837 in Washington, D.C. into slavery. An aunt purchased her freedom when she was a girl, and she worked as a domestic servant while going to school. Coppin's interest in learning was apparent early on, and an opportunity for higher education occurred when she attended Oberlin College.

As the first college to admit women and Black students, Oberlin was a godsend for Coppin and there, she became its first pupil-teacher. Coppin opened an evening school for freedmen to continue educating her people. She traveled to Philadelphia and taught at the Philadelphia Institute For Colored Youth, which is now Cheyney University. In 1869, she was promoted to her history-making role as principal of the school.

Coppin married A.M.E. Minister Rev. Levi J. Coppin in 1881. After retiring in 1902, Coppin joined her husband as a missionary in Cape Town, South Africa. She returned to Philadelphia in 1907 and completed a book, *Reminiscences of School Life*, and *Hints on Teaching*, that was published in 1913, the same year that she passed.

In 1926, a teacher training school was named the Fanny Jackson Coppin Normal School in her memory, which is now Coppin State.

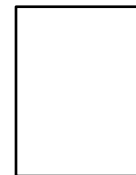
