

### "An Empowered Laity"

Greetings my brothers and sisters in Christ! Another glorious day has been given to us and we shall rejoice and be glad in it. In the book, <u>The Lay Driven Church: How to Empower the People in Your Church to Share the Tasks of Ministry,</u> the author challenges misguided yet traditional thoughts about who should actually drive the ministry within a church. In a revolutionary way, Melvin J. Steinbron argues that the laity, the people of God, is to be the 'main' doer of ministry in a church and not the pastor. He is not saying that there is no need for a pastor, but what he is saying is that the pastor and paid staff are to empower, teach, train, and deploy the laity to engage in ministry.

Imagine for a minute what Wesley Church would look like if every baptized believer were involved in some ministry? Imagine for a minute how different our church campus and surrounding community would look if every baptized believer were involved in ministry? Our church would be abuzz with all kinds of ministry activity. Every generation's needs would be met. The children, youth, young adults, adults, baby boomers, and the seasoned saints would all have thriving ministries to join and be a part of. There would not be one unmet need within our church and community if every baptized believer were involved in ministry. God's work is so important that it cannot be done by the typical 20 percent of the congregation who do 80 percent of the work. Much of God's work is left undone because there are simply not enough people willing to commit to ministry. We all have to begin to believe that every baptized believer is a minister. Once we realize that then we will be on our way to fulfilling our mission of making disciples of Jesus the Christ. It takes teamwork to make our dream work.

Come here Nehemiah. In the story of Nehemiah inspiring the rebuilding of Jerusalem's walls, it would not have happened without the people saying, "Let us rise up and build." It would not have happened if the people didn't possess "a mind to work." Come here Moses. Moses could not have become the legendary lawgiver and liberator of Israel if the people refused to participate. God's work cannot get accomplished without the full and committed participation from God's people.

Today, won't you commit to get involved in one of the ministries at Wesley? We not only need every member to be involved in ministry, but we also need every member to display awesome commitment. The Bible supports the argument that the saints are to be equipped for ministry:

11 And He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, 12 for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ, 13 till we all come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a perfect man, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ (Ephesians 4:11-13).

It takes all of the people of God to do all of the work of God. Have a blessed week!

As the number of COVID-19 cases continues to increase, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Office of Minority Health (OMH) remarks that the COVID-19 pandemic has disproportionately impacted communities of color.

Studies show that COVID-19 vaccines are effective at keeping you from getting COVID-19. It has been proven through science that the COVID-19 vaccination is integral in helping us reconnect in-person with our friends and families and start doing some things we had stopped doing because of the pandemic.

Here are a few ways you can help in the fight against COVID-19:



#### As more vaccination are coming out:

- Get the facts about COVID-19 vaccines.
- Share accurate vaccine information.
- Participate in clinical trials.
- Get vaccinated when the time comes.
- Volunteer at your local testing site.



### Take these extra steps to protect yourself and others around you before and after you get vaccinated.

- Wear a mask to protect yourself and others and stop the spread of COVID-19.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- Stay at least 6 feet (about 2 arm lengths) from others who don't live with you.
- Avoid crowds. The more people you are in contact with, the more likely you are to be exposed to COVID-19.

## Robin Kelly, Elected to Congress to Fight Gun Violence, Must Be Feeling Awfully Frustrated

U.S. Rep. Robin Kelly, a Democrat, must be frustrated. On the steam of her passion for gun control, Kelly was elected in 2013 to serve Illinois' 2<sup>nd</sup> Congressional District, which stretches from Chicago's South Side to Kankakee. Yet the poisonous threads of gun violence continue to be embedded in the fabric of American life. "I am devastated" by "each and every family" that has lost someone to gun violence, Kelly said gamely on Thursday, speaking at a virtual meeting of the City Club of Chicago, "and I am committed to advocating for policies and legislation that will help save lives and end this terrible epidemic."

The epidemic is raging. Chicago is reeling from two horrific incidents involving guns. On March 29, police shot Adam Toledo, 13, in Little Village. He allegedly had a gun. Then on Tuesday, 21-month-old Kayden Swann was shot in the head in an apparent road rage incident on Lake Shore Drive. He is on life support at a Chicago hospital. Every weekend, multiple murders and dozens of shootings torment our city. As Kelly spoke on Thursday afternoon, President Joe Biden was appearing in the White House Rose Garden to announce plans for executive actions to restrict gun access.

Kelly applauded Biden for the steps "that he can take without legislation. Since we have such a hard time in getting things passed." Kelly recently introduced the Prevent Gun Trafficking Act, a federal law that would prohibit the straw purchase of firearms. Such legislation might attract bipartisan support in the House, but it faces dimmer prospects in the Senate. Meanwhile, violence is reaching into the highest levels of our democracy. On Jan. 6, Kelly was in the House gallery as legislators were voting to certify the results of the November presidential election. As a mob of insurrectionists surged into the Capitol, Kelly and her colleagues were told to put on gas masks.

"I was," she recalled, "on my hands and knees on the floor behind the wall that protects us from falling onto the House floor." Kelly, who was recently elected the new chair of the Illinois Democratic Party, said she works hard to reach out to Republicans to build support for gun control and other legislative measures. Yet Jan. 6 epitomizes why bipartisanship is so imperiled by our toxic politics. "We know that some of our (Republican House) colleagues were involved in that. They were giving speeches to the people that later, you know, came into the Capitol carrying the Confederate flag," Kelly continued. "We

saw who did not vote for President Biden's, you know, election to be certified. It's very difficult to work with people like that that. That are just being negative to be negative."

### **Little Known Black History Fact**

### **Ruth Simmons**



**Ruth Simmons** has achieved a series of historic firsts. At a point in life where most are retired or soon will be, the longtime educator and academic is still going. Simmons is currently the eighth president of Prairie View A&M University, coming out of retirement to become the first woman to lead the institution.

Simmons was born July 3, 1945 in Grapeland, Texas as the youngest of 12 siblings. Her parents were sharecroppers who relocated to Houston. She entered and graduated from Dillard University in 1967, then earned a master's and Ph. D in Romantic Literature from Harvard University in 1970 and 1973 respectively.

A series of academic positions with schools such as the University of New Orleans, California State University-Northside, University of Southern California, and Princeton University followed. She also served as provost of Spelman College.

In 1995, Simmons marked her first big achievement by becoming president of Smith College making her the first Black woman to lead a major college or university. She then joined Brown University in 2001, becoming the first Black president of an Ivy League institution and brought sweeping changes to the school.

At the urging of her brother Clarence, a former student and athlete at Prairie View, Simmons took on an interim presidential position with the school and decided to stay. Part of her reasoning is that many Prairie View students are poor and lack proper guidance and an example such as herself. Further, the school has issues graduating students due to the financial woes of the student body which Simmons hopes to address and correct.
