## "What's In Your Will?"

While working out at the gym, one day I noticed a picture on the wall, no doubt from the Successories Company, which had a definition of Perseverance. In the picture was a photo of a man running up the stairs in a stadium. He had a lot of stairs to run but the caption underneath him read, "Winning is not based upon skill, talent, or knowledge, but on who has the will to get the job done." I like that. That lets us know that whatever we want out of our purpose-driven lives, we must possess the will to go after it no matter what it takes. Nothing is ever handed to anyone. Whatever one wants, one must go after it with dogged determination and a can-do attitude. If your need is a job, you need a strong will to look for one even if you constantly face rejection letter after rejection letter. You must walk by faith and not by sight believing that you can endure all things through Christ who strengthens you. What's in your will? If your need is a healthier marriage, you need a strong will to seek God's will for your marriage, Christian marriage counseling, and the desire to do whatever it takes to make the marriage vibrant again. What's in your will? If your need is to lose weight and get healthier, do you have the will to join a health club, work out at least 3 times a week, and change your dietary habits? To get healthy it takes a lot of will-power. What's in your will? The "will" is defined as "the mental faculty by which one deliberately chooses or decides upon a course of action." Simply put, the "will" is one's deliberate desire to get something done no matter what it takes.

In the Luke 14:25-35 pericope, Jesus painfully reminds the large crowd that is following him about the cost of being his disciple. There were three things the people were required to do in order to be his disciples. First, they were to love Jesus and his cause more than family and life itself. Second, they were required to follow Jesus even if it meant facing their own cross, which was a metaphor for death. Third, they were to learn the art of detachment from materialism by giving away all of their possessions. These were hard sayings to digest for them and even for us today. But Jesus wanted to test their will power. Jesus wanted to see if they were willing to give up some things in order to go up in other things. I must tell you that the Christian lifestyle is not just about giving up stuff but there are rewards as well. Those who persevere in discipleship by bearing their cross will wear a crown one day but there are earthly rewards as well. If we work like hell to implement the Kingdom of God in our midst, the reward is that we will create a heavenly community in the here and now. If we work hard with dogged determination to erase and/or lessen racism, gun violence, drug dependency, poverty, a debt-mindset, all forms of violence, biblical illiteracy, spiritual impotence, backwards-thinking, and many other vices, we can birth a new community into existence. We can at least start with our own community of faith and then branch out. What's in your will?

To grow as disciples, we must possess a powerful collective will to "act out" what God's Word "puts out". It is not about who we are or what we know or what skills we have, but it is more about this question, "Do we have the strong desire to take ourselves and the church higher and farther than ever imagined?" *What's in our Will?*

### Leave Politics Out of International Race to Vaccinate the World Against COVID-19

India is now ground zero for COVID-19. On Saturday, it suffered a record of more than 335,000 new infections and more than 4,000 deaths in one day. Hospitals are running out of oxygen and beds. Morgues and crematoria are overwhelmed. In total, a staggering 22.6 million people in India have been infected, with 246,116 deaths. With 1.3 billion people, India is the second most populous country in the world.

Last week, the Biden administration finally challenged the U.S. drug industry, announcing that the White House would support an international waiver of intellectual property protections on COVID-19 vaccines during the pandemic. This is a long overdue measure, but if the industry continues to resist, the negotiations are likely to take months that the world can ill afford. Though the companies benefited greatly from government subsidies and guaranteed purchases — and have seen their profits and stocks soar — they have a large stake in controlling production to ensure continued profits over time. The Biden administration decision — if aggressively enforced — will put public health over private profit. The pandemic is truly a global threat that requires a global mobilization.

At the national level, global cooperation has been slow to develop. Instead, the surge to supply countries in need is propelled less from a unified global effort and more from a competitive national "vaccine diplomacy," with India, China, Russia and now the U.S. vying to win hearts and minds through vaccine supplies.

Fighting the pandemic isn't just the responsibility of governments. This is a global, human tragedy. The pandemic spreads through the air, so no people are safe unless all are safe. We need increased global efforts to get the vaccine into rural areas and into the poorest ghettos and barrios of the poorest nations.

Joe Biden announced that he would rely on science for advice, but we can't rely on science or on government alone. Popular mobilization is essential. If we are to address common global threats such as contagions or climate change or nuclear war, we must develop a global perspective. Now it becomes ever more apparent that, as Dr. Martin Luther King taught long ago, "all life is interrelated. We are caught in an inescapable network of mutuality; tied in a single garment of destiny. Whatever affects one directly, affects all indirectly. ... As long as diseases are rampant ... no man can be totally healthy, even if

he just got a clean bill of health from the finest clinic in America." In the global struggle to meet the threat of Covid-19, this basic truth is more important than ever.

## Little Known Black History Fact

## **Bishop Leontine Kelly**



**Leontine Turpeau Current Kelly** was a bishop of the United Methodist Church, making history on this day in 1984. She became the first African-American woman, and just the second woman overall, to be ordained by a major Christian denomination.

Leontine Turpeau was born on March 5, 1920 in Washington. D.C. Her father, David Turpeau Sr., was a prominent Methodist minister and Ohio congressman for many years. Ms. Turpeau completed her undergraduate studies at Virginia Union 1960 and studied at various institutions before earning her master of divinity degree from the Union Theological Seminary in 1976.

Kelly's first marriage was to the late Gloster Current, a minister and former deputy executive director of the NAACP. The pair had three children together. In 1956, she married Rev. David Kelly. Kelly was a Certified Lay Speaker in the church in the late '60's and was later ordained a deacon and elder. Kelly's first calling was the classroom and her call to the ministry came after the death of her second husband.


According to reports, the school district wanted Kelly to enter the ministry in her late husband's stead, but she initially resisted as she didn't get the call from God to do so. In her words, God eventually did call her to ministry where she rose to become one of the more visible members of her denomination, becoming an icon for international women's rights and job equity for all. Kelly was later inducted into the National Women's Hall of Fame.


