

"You Didn't Join a Church, You Joined a Movement!"

Greetings, family, in the name of Jesus! I want to afflict the comfortable and comfort the afflicted today. We have to get something straight. When you decided to join, hook-up with, or devote your life to Wesley UMC, you didn't do so to be a stationary, immovable statue in the house of God. Protestant churches don't have statues like Catholic churches do. We don't have statues because it promotes idolatry. Whenever we do what we want to do in God's house, and subsequently do nothing, then we are becoming idols unto ourselves. We begin to worship ourselves, i.e., believing that what we think, believe, and do is "worth" more than what God wants us to think, believe, and do.

Some of us have lost our minds when it comes to determining what true discipleship is. We are supposed to emulate what Jesus and the first disciples did. They weren't stationary, stagnant, or sourful saints. They were energetic, enthusiastic, and empowered to change the world one person at a time. Jesus started a movement because his speech was always flavored with action words: "Come and follow me. Rise up and walk. Go and make disciples. Lazarus, come forth." He moved crowds and individuals. Every evangelistic moment was not an Acts 2:41 "three-thousand soul moment." Naw, one person or family at a time was their modus operandi. The early disciples understood that they had joined a movement and not just a "moment" where they paused for 90 minutes in their busy schedule to worship God in a building and then resume their normal lives. No, no, no! We are not even supposed to be worried about always feeling good and having our "hands out" when we come to the Lord's house.

Worship is not just about you receiving but it is also about you giving. And one thing we should give God during worship is praise for success in making disciples and spreading the good news that God saves through the redemptive life, death, and resurrection of Jesus the Christ. Worship can be a praise party after you have been successful in fulfilling the discipleship mandate which is to replicate the Jesus in you in someone else. What do I mean? Our mission for two thousand years has been to bring people into the body of Christ so that earth can look like heaven. Our job for two thousand years has been to transform our confused world with the message of love, truth, power, forgiveness and reconciliation. What have we been doing at Wesley UMC? It appears that we have neglected our evangelistic objectives. If we are scared to share Jesus with someone, we must remember that God has not given us a spirit of fear but of love, power, and a sound mind. If we are tired, God has a second wind, called the Holy Ghost, which He will send us if we ask Him.

Our church is half-full on Sunday morning and it is time that it becomes full and overflowing! We have wonderful people, worship, and ministries to offer a "seeking" and "lost" populace. We are a great church and we stack up well against any church in the Northern Illinois Conference of the United Methodist Church. Christianity is about movement and building momentum in order to build the kingdom of God, one person at a time. We want a "movement culture" at Wesley UMC. And the movement will be centered on ministry excellence. Have a great week.

Morning Scripture Acts 4:13-22 (NKJV)

- ¹³ Now when they saw the boldness of Peter and John, and perceived that they were uneducated and untrained men, they marveled. And they realized that they had been with Jesus.
- ¹⁴ And seeing the man who had been healed standing with them, they could say nothing against it.

Mental health is a topic that many Black men consider taboo. As a result, mental health is rarely discussed, leading African American men to suffer in silence too often.

Did You Know?



7% of African-American men will develop depression in their lifetime.



Depression is not a weakness. It is an illness that can cause disability and even death.



Men experience depression differently. Men who are depressed may be more likely to be very tired, feel irritable, and have difficulty sleeping.



When mental disorders like depression aren't treated, African American men are more vulnerable to drug or alcohol use, homelessness, incarceration, homicide, and suicide.

Pathway to Healing




Heal Through Understanding: Seek help from a trained, culturally competent mental health professional. A primary care professional is also a great place to start.

Trump Partisans Want Biden to Fail Even If It Costs American Lives

The political divide in this country grows ever more menacing, even as the crises facing us — exemplified by the fires raging in the West and the resurgence of the COVID variant across the country — grow more destructive. With the Congress and the voters divided, the mainstream media keeps urging bipartisan cooperation to move forward. But that assumes that both parties have a good faith stake in making progress. The plain reality is that Donald Trump and his Republican followers are stoking rebellion, not cooperation. Trump continues to deny that he lost the 2020 election. Across the country, Republicans are reinforcing his big lie with utterly brazen efforts to spread rumors about fraud, even though Republican state election officials, Republican judges, Trump's own attorney general have all exposed the claims of fraud as bogus.

Now, in states with Republican legislatures, Trump partisans are passing bills to strip the election officials of their authority, and to sponsor partisan "audits" of votes — but, as in Texas, only in counties that Trump lost, arguing there is no need to look at counties that he won. They are pushing a package of restrictive voting laws designed to make it harder to vote — and often targeted specifically on African Americans, Latinos and the young who voted against Trump by large margins. The result is to feed extremist anger against American democracy. Trump partisans want Biden to fail, even if it costs American lives. They have worked to discredit U.S. public health officials, to support resistance to sensible measures like wearing a mask and now to spread the rumors and lies that have helped fuel resistance to the vaccine. The direct result is that the new variant is spiking among the unvaccinated across the country, with the U.S. death toll rising once more. Even a pandemic that threatens us all could not bring them to join together in support of responsible action. Their focus on making Biden fail led congressional Republicans to vote in lockstep against the Rescue Plan that was vital to helping the economy recover and providing a life preserver for the millions displaced when the pandemic forced the shutdown of much of the economy.

The most costly war in American history was the Civil War, which broke out when the South seceded to protect the spread slavery to new states joining the Union. Now Trump is fanning the flames of revolt among the minority of Americans that support him. With the economy just beginning to recover, climate change and pandemic threatening us, entrenched racial disparities dividing us, it is time for the majority to act — not to allow an aroused minority and cowed elected officials to stand in the way.

Little Known Black History Fact

Dr. George Washington Carver



George Washington Carver (c. 1864 to January 5, 1943) was born into slavery and went on to become a botanist and one of the most prominent scientists and inventors of his time as well as a teacher at the Tuskegee Institute. Carver devised hundreds of products using one major crop — the peanut — including dyes, plastics and gasoline.

Carver's work at the helm of the Tuskegee Institute's agricultural department included groundbreaking research on plant biology, much of which focused on the development of new uses for crops including peanuts, sweet potatoes, soybeans and pecans. Carver invented hundreds of products, including more than 300 from peanuts (milk, plastics, paints, dyes, cosmetics, medicinal oils, soap, ink, wood stains) and 118 from sweet potatoes (molasses, postage stamp glue, flour, vinegar and synthetic rubber) and even a type of gasoline. At the time, cotton production was on the decline in the South; overproduction of a single crop had left many fields exhausted and barren. Carver suggested planting peanuts and soybeans, both of which could restore nitrogen to the soil, along with sweet potatoes. While these crops grew well in southern climates, there was little demand. Carver's inventions and research solved this problem and helped struggling sharecroppers in the South, many of them former slaves now faced with necessary cultivation.

Carver went on to become a prominent scientific expert and one of the most famous African-Americans of his time. Carver achieved international fame in political and professional circles.

President Theodore Roosevelt admired his work and sought his advice on agricultural matters in the United States. Carver was also recognized abroad for his scientific expertise. In 1916, he was made a member of the British Royal Society of Arts — a rare honor for an American. Carver also advised Indian leader Mahatma Gandhi on matters of agriculture and nutrition.


