Loving Hard to Love People

Dear friends, since God loved us that much, we surely ought to love each other. 1 John 4:11 (NLT)

"You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." –Jesus, Matthew 5:43-44 (NIV)

Loving hard to love people means...

...becoming a more loving person

I pray that your love will overflow more and more. Philippians 1:9

But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness... Galatians 5:22 (NLT)

... giving up my rights

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Galatians 5:22-23 (NLT)

Accept the one whose faith is weak, without quarreling over disputable matters. One person's faith allows them to not wear a mask, but another, wears a mask. The one who does not wear a mask must not treat with contempt the one who does, and the one who does wear a mask everything must not judge the one who does not, for God has accepted them. If your brother or sister is distressed because of a mask, you are no longer acting in love. Romans 14:1-4, 15
