#### THE BEST LIFE IS A LIFE SURRENDERED TO GOD. A surrendered life is the best life.

The LORD gave this message to Jonah son of Amittai: "Get up and go to the great city of Nineveh. Announce my judgment against it because I have seen how wicked its people are."
But Jonah ran away from the LORD and headed for Tarshish. Jonah 1:1-3a (NIV)
