A Call to Worship

Remember God's Character

God is Never Outmaneuvered

Would you describe yourself as a Change Avoider or a Change Seeker?

What happens when changes appear out of nowhere? How does that make you feel? How does that impact your confidence in yourself? How does it impact your confidence in God?

What about when changes are planned ahead of time? How or why are they different? What role does nervousness play when you can see change coming?

We tend to view change as something unexpected to be strenuously avoided, and when rough times come, we can react with anger, resentment, fear, and feelings of abandonment. Today's message calls us to remember that God is sovereign – always in control. God always has a plan, and He always wants what's best for His people. Sometimes that plan means that trials come into our lives.

As a group read Psalm 33 together.

What sticks out to you most when reading this Psalm? What do you find confusing? What does this teach us about people? What does it tell us about God?

Curt said that this Psalm makes a big circle. It starts with praising God, reminds us of all He has done, which brings us back to praising God by singing a new song to God (because we're reminded of all He has done!).

The last 3 verses show a self-dedication each worshipper of God should have. They follow an Effect & Cause pattern (I will do "this" because God has done "that"). What is the pattern given here?

Who in your life can you share today's LifeGroup session with? Who do you think could be encouraged to hear what Psalm 33 has to say?

Close your LifeGroup by praying for each other to live out today's encouragement from the Bible.
