Do any of you use apps to connect with God? Which ones do you like? *As a group or family, try out one of these suggested apps: YouVersion or New City Catechism

Were you able to find a name for each of your High 5 fingers this week? Thumb = a friend Index finger = leader, boss, teacher, coach Middle = unlikeable person Ring = family Pinkie = the last person on your mind



In what ways did God present opportunities to care for them or serve them this week? Giving yourself a letter grade (A-F), how well did you do with those opportunities?

How do you like to be greeted when you arrive someplace? What kind of greetings to you try to avoid?

Why do you think God would want His people to master greeting each other?

Curt pointed out 2 people from a long list that were named in the Bible: Phoebe & Ampliatus.

Phoebe was a servant who physically carried the letters of Paul from group to group & Ampliatus was a Roman slave who followed Jesus. Who in your life, past or current, encourages you with God's Word on a regular basis? How could you greet them (or encourage them) this week? Of all the people that you know who follow Jesus, who is easily overlooked because their social status may mean they don't have all the benefits of a good income, nice home, etc? How could you greet (or encourage them) this week?

Following the hand theme, Curt gave us another High 5 illustration to consider as we focus on the five people/groups presented last message (see above). This week he encouraged us to think of 5 ways to greet or encourage one another: Time: focused time together Touch: physical expressions of love/care Tell: spoken or written affirmation To Do: tangible acts of serving Treasure: practical or unexpected gifts Think of ways you could use these 5 tools to greet or encourage your High 5 list this week.

What are the likely reasons you won't do these things? How can this group encourage you to fight through those reasons?

Close your LifeGroup by praying for each other to live out these tools for those you put on your High 5 list. Ask God to help you become an initiator of God-like greetings this week.
