Newly made wine must ferment which means it's active, converting grapes, sugar & yeast into ethanol and carbon dioxide which makes alcohol.

Ethanol - a colorless volatile flammable liquid which is produced by the natural fermentation of sugars.

The dead and the living don't mix!

If our new life was wine, which needs to ferment or mature, in what ways does the forgiven life of a Christ-follower need to ferment, too?

How have you experienced this fermentation in your walk with God?

Read Hebrews 12:1, 2.

What things have helped this process? What things have hurt this process?

This weekend Taylor shared that people have helped her grow in Christ. Who helped you learn and grow in faith? Who are you helping to grow spiritually?

How can this group support each other's fermentation process?

Take time to prayer for each other. Make a decision today to live out what you read in Hebrews 12:1, 2.
