

HAPPY ANNIVERSARY! It is the first anniversary since Covid-19 invaded our lives. One whole year! In some ways, it has sped by yet in other ways, it seems like it has been an eternity.

How is it going for you? How has your life changed over the past year? Are you hanging in there or are you wanting to escape from the confines that it have been placed on you and everyone else? I hear from many of you that you have received not only your first shot but your second, and I have heard from some who will now be returning to worship in person since they have their shots.

It was interesting that one of my colleagues who recently retired said it did not bother him to preside at worship in the congregation he was serving but he is not ready yet to attend worship elsewhere. I understand what he is saying and think that I would feel the same way.

In some respects, we have made great strides here at Prince of Peace. We have been open for worship since the end of last May and returned to Holy Communion since September. As I read the Bible, I see things that I had not seen before which reminds me that the Word of God is still very much alive.

I wanted to keep this incredibly positive because that is what we need right now as we celebrate this first anniversary. After all, we never had a celebration at the beginning let alone a honeymoon. Hopefully, we will have a great celebration before the second anniversary and everyone will come to the party.







## Alas! And Did My Savior Bleed

"Alas! And Did My Savior Bleed" was based on Galatians 6:14. "But God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ."

This hymn is now considered the finest hymn ever written in the English language. It was written by Isaac Watts (1674 - 1748) at the age of 23. He went on to become a prolific and popular hymn writer and is credited with some 750 hymns.

After graduation from university, he tutored the children of a wealthy family of Dissenters. During this time he joined Mark Lane Independent Chapel. Soon he was asked to be a teacher in the church, and in 1698, he was hired as associate pastor. There, on his twenty-fourth birthday, he preached his first sermon.

In 1700 he became Senior Pastor, a position he retained the rest of his life. It is said he was a brilliant Bible student and his sermons brought the church to life.

This hymn has touched the hearts of millions through the centuries. This hymn later played a major role in the conversion of the great American Hymnal.

In 1851, a thirty-one year old woman with sight impairment heard this hymn at a revival service at the John Street Methodist Church in New York City. "After a prayer was offered," she recalled, "they began to sing the grand old consecration hymn, 'Alas! And Did My Savior Bleed' and when they reached the third line of the fifth stanza, 'Here, Lord, I give myself away', my very soul was flooded with celestial light."

That woman was Fanny Crosby who went on to become the greatest writer of gospel songs in the past century. We never know how deeply our lives will touch the lives of others.

# **WORSHIP SAFETY MEASURES UPDATE**



Dear Members of Prince of Peace,

These are very unusual times that we are living in and it has become day-by-day that we go on. We are checking numbers on Covid-19 and its spread. Numbers go up, and numbers go down.

We published the different phases and the guidelines for each phase in the newsletter. Even though the governor has issued Stage 3 we will continue at Stage 2. With the age of most of our members...including your pastor being in the at-risk category, we continue to wear masks and evaluate safety measures as we worship together.

You can review the measures in the attached, and it is important to keep the following in mind for the everyone's safety:

- •Masks are required to be worn at Worship
- Pew seating will be directed by ushers
- •Post worship, ushers will oversee the exiting of members
- •Social congregating is **not acceptable** in the narthex prior and post-worship

We recently introduced Holy Communion back into weekly worship using the safest practices available. We are using an individual wafer dispenser, we ask you to bring your own small cup and wine is poured into it (we also have individual cups available) and we are using port wine only which has a higher alcohol content.

We are working hard to get through this time of uncertainty using the best methods available. Many changes have had to take place over the past few months, and we are doing our best to keep you safe and informed. With the help of the Holy Spirit we will get through this a stronger and healthier congregation serving our Lord and Savior and the community around us.
