Confession and Forgiveness

Then the first reading for this Sunday may be read, as follows.

FIRST READING: Acts 1:15-17, 21-26

¹⁵In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred twenty persons) and said, ¹⁶"Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus—¹⁷for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry." ²¹So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, ²²beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection." ²³So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. ²⁴Then they prayed and said, "Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen ²⁵to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place." ²⁶And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles.

Those who do not believe in God have made him a liar by not believing in the testimony that God has given concerning his Son. ¹¹And this is the testimony: God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. ¹²Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life. ¹³I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life.

Then the gospel reading may be read, as follows.

Gospel: John 17:6-19

The holy Gospel according to John. Glory to you, O Lord.

[Jesus prayed:] ⁶"I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. ⁷Now they know that everything you have given me is from you; ⁸ for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me. ⁹I am asking on their behalf; I am not asking on behalf of the world, but on behalf of those whom you gave me, because they are yours. ¹⁰All mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them. ¹¹And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. "Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one. ¹²While I was with them, I protected them in your name that you have given me. I guarded them, and not one of them was lost except the one destined to be lost, so that the scripture might be fulfilled. ¹³But now I am coming to you, and I speak these things in the world so that they may have my joy made complete in themselves. ¹⁴I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. ¹⁵I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one. ¹⁶They do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. ¹⁷Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. ¹⁸As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. ¹⁹And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth."

SERMON—Pastor Ida Iverson

"JESUS PRAYS FOR US"

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

Our gospel lesson we have today is called "The High Priestly Prayer". In the gospel of John, we do not have the telling of the Last Supper, but Jesus is with his disciples on that night, and he is telling them what is about to transpire over the next few days and beyond. In our three-year lectionary, this pray is split up into three parts. In the first part, Jesus is praying for himself; in the second, which we have today, it is for his disciples who are with him, and the third is for those who are yet to come...you and me.

It is not easy to listen to because it seems to go round and round in circles saying the same thing, but as I have said before when something is repeated it is because it is important and needs to be emphasized. So as his disciples are hearing this, they might not have been paying attention the first time or even the second time, but as it is repeated their ears perk-up and they get what he is saying. They understand how he has made the Father known to them, how they have kept the Father's Word, and how it is that they are not only his but the Father's as well as they stay in the world. Jesus is telling them that they will continue what he had started and that just as he had been sanctified they too will be sanctified. Sanctified, which like the word abide, is one of those church words that most of the time we hear it, but do we understand what it means? To be sanctified is to be made holy or to be set apart. What that means for you and me is that we are to be set apart to do God's work just as Jesus was set apart to do God's work. This is what Jesus is praying in this prayer for his disciples, that they are to be set apart to do God's work in his stead.

As Jesus is repeating himself in this prayer that his disciples are hearing, I thought about the statistics on how many times a person must invite another person to come to worship with them. Now, I do not know if the number has changed recently or not, but it was twelve several years ago. When I came out of seminary it was said that a Lutheran will invite another person once every twenty-five years. I will let you do the math on that one.

I wonder how any one of us would have felt if we had been listening to Jesus praying for us in such as way. Would we even believe what he was saying true? Would we wonder if we could continue and do what he is saying we are to do...to continue his work in the world? After all this is some lofty stuff Jesus is saying to his Father about them, and they are just some ordinary people like you and me. I remember after I had arrived at my first call out of seminary, as I was leaving the church with the choir director one night and she said to me, "You are my spirit leader now." I panicked. I did not feel that I had any qualifications to be anybody's spiritual leader, let alone this woman who I had only known a short amount of time but had already come to respect her and knew that we would work well together. But her spiritual leader? That felt like quite a reach. So, I can imagine what the disciples were thinking; "Sure, Jesus, we are going to carry on from where you left off."

The reality is that they did carry on where Jesus left off. It was not always easy for those first few as they were ridiculed, rejected, and persecuted, but they were not the only ones that persevered after the ascension of Jesus. Over the centuries there have been many, and there are still many and into the future there will still be others as well who will persevere and carry on.

What is happening as Jesus is praying for his disciples here? He is praying for them as a community. He is praying "them" and "they". It is not to be a singular endeavor, but a community of believers working together.

Here today, do you and I think of ourselves as being sanctified, made holy and set apart for God's use? Well, do we? Are we just here because our friends are here or are we here because together, we can make a difference in the world? It is in knowing and sharing the truth that Jesus did not come into the world to condemn the world but to save it. That is the message of the Word that we are to keep telling anyone who has ears to hear.

We can also learn lessons from the Old Testament. Today in our Psalm...which is the first of the Psalms, it gives us a way to also look at Jesus praying for his disciples as preparation for them as they are set apart to continue when he is no longer with them physically. It says that those who find joy in life are those who delight in the law of the Lord and meditate on God's teaching day and night. The law, of course, refers to the Ten Commandments. When we look at them as being instructions from God, for his people and that includes you and me, they teach us how to be in relationship not only with God but each other. The wicked that the Psalm talks about scoff at the instructions, they scoff at God's teachings, many are

angry and unwilling to grow. You could say they become stagnate and alone because who would want to be around them? This is not what God wants or what Jesus wants. No, instead it is to be in community to grow, and find joy in the life each of us has been given, being sanctified in truth together. I would say it is impossible to find joy as a solitary person. It is in the company of others that we grow. Remember that vine from a few weeks ago? What happens to the branches that become detached? They withered and died and are burned. The same happens with the chaff because it holds no life. It is when you and I become "we" along with the "they" and "them", that Jesus' prayer is answered and we are sanctified as a community...set apart for God's use in Jesus' name alone, where the truth of the Word can be lived out, and joy made complete. Amen.
