## Camp Spring Projects continued from page 1

- Clean sand volleyball pit - clear sticks & leaves from pit; - check sides for rubber siding coming off
- Clean Nurse/Staff cabin - clean bathroom counters; - clean mattresses; - clean & wipe down showers; - vacuum carpet & rugs; -clean toilets; - sweep & mop floors
- Install bird houses in Prairie Grass - pick up zip ties & scissors from office; - take bird houses out to staked areas in grass & install on stakes
- Clean 2 cabins - same details as previous day

### May 3rd:

- Clean canteen - wipe down windows; - clean fridge & freezer; - sweep floors; - wipe off shelving
- Clean gutters on cabins & building - get ladder & gloves from office; - clear gutters of leaves & sticks
- Clean kitchen - wipe down counters & underneath; - clean walls; - clean oven vents; - wipe down inside of shelving units; - clean baseboards; -sweep & mop floor
- Clean 2 cabins - same details as previous days

### May 4th:

- Clean pool - remove all leaves & debris from pool; -clear water from pit; - spray & brush down inside of pool; - take plugs off of deep end pit
- Clean pool house - wipe down sinks & showers; - clean toilets & restock; -clean off trashcans & restock; - spray down entire floor
- Clean small multi-purpose building - wipe down windows & sills; - clean out fridge & wipe down; - wipe down countertops; - wipe off mattresses; - vacuum floors; - wipe down inside of showers & shower curtains; - wipe down mirrors; - sweep & mop floors
- Clean a cabin - same details as previous days
- Tree work & trimming - prune bushes by edge of camp road; - prune bushes by camp house & dumpster; - trim edges of woods; - clear trails of fallen logs & sticks

## Sisters-in-Christ

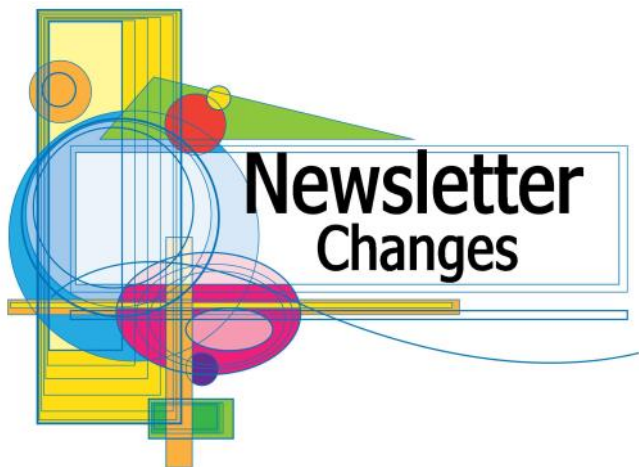

In 2019, Move will explore the life of Elijah and help high school students understand that: You are called into the story of God. You can trust that God can provide because He is real. When you despair, God will sustain

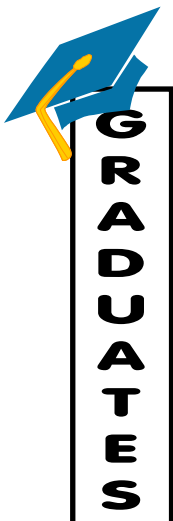

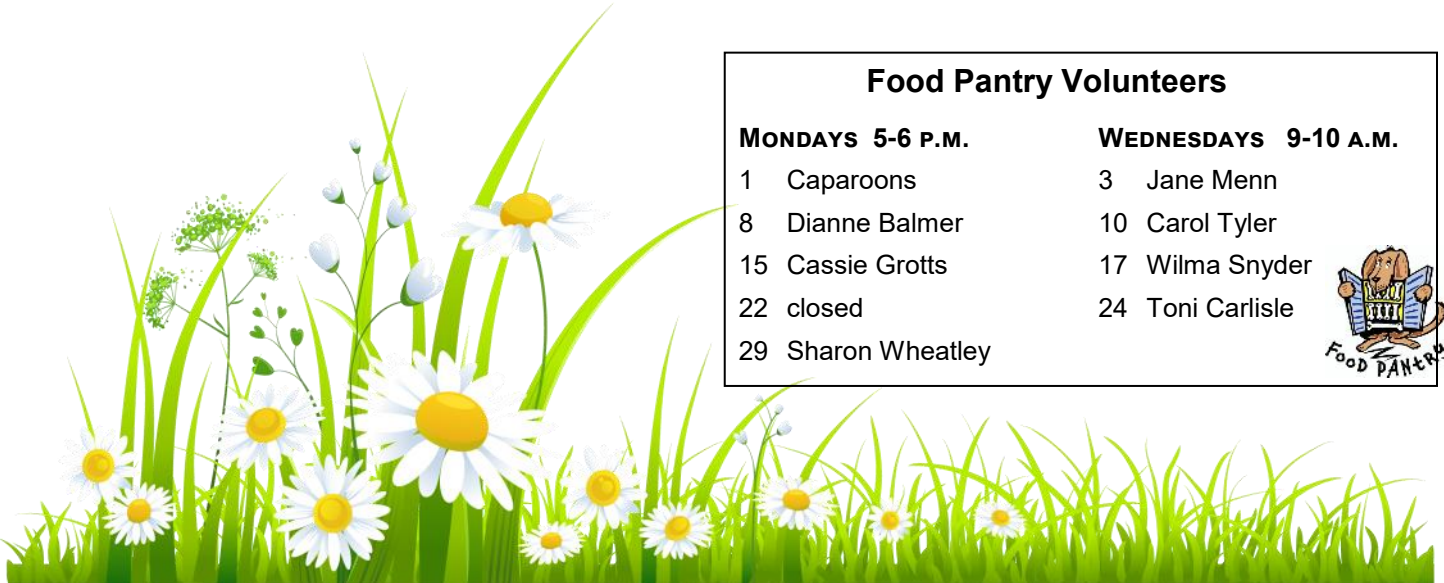

Our partnership with CampDoc allows you to give more detailed medical information for your camper, assuring that we have everything we need to give them the best and safest experience possible. CampDoc also allows you to set up a payment plan. You can pay a minimal down payment, then set up the remaining balance to be paid over the course of the months leading up to your child's session.

Share your testimony! We would love to hear how LCSC has impacted your life. Share your testimony so that others can see how important LCSC is in the lives of God's people.

Lastly, our GIVE page offers you an opportunity to set up recurring donations, GIVE a one-time gift, and even GIVE to our new capital funds campaign at any of the giving levels: \$20/\$40/\$60."

Just for Girls 2.0 is for young women going into 9th grade in the fall thru high school graduates of the year of registration. Designed to encourage young women to embrace one another and develop relationships that will help them as they continue to develop their self identity and grow in their faith."
