## Nichols' Worth

Who is your favorite Bible character and why? During the Sunday morning sermon time, we have spent a lot of time studying the life and teachings of the Apostle Paul. In fact, at the time of this writing, we are getting ready to show the movie Paul Apostle of Christ on Sunday night. It's a movie that portrays Paul's life in prison.

One of the things I want to do with this article is simply review where we've been in regards to Paul's life and teaching:

1. Transform my Religion into Relationship – Paul was very religious. He was all about duty and function. But he had no connection or relationship with God. His religion was all about the stuff HE would do in order to be favored by God. When Paul is confronted with Christ on the road to Damascus, he soon begins a relationship with Jesus and it completely transforms his life. You can read about these events in Philippians 3:1-11.


If you are looking for ways to help out the camp, here are just a few...

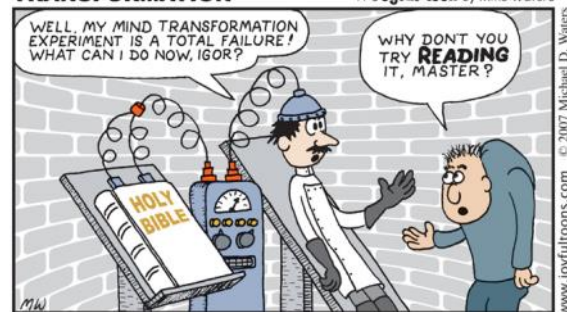

2. Transform my Past – Paul had a past...he had a reputation. And even after He came to Jesus, people were skeptical that he actually was a changed man. It's true that Jesus has the power to change your past! Your sins are no longer held against your account when you and I come to Jesus. Our sins are transformed...they used to be red as scarlet but Christ transforms them to be white as snow! But one thing that takes time to transform is trust...and reputation. But that comes as part of the fruit of a transformed past! You can read more about that in Acts 9.

3. Transform my Ministry – Paul had a ministry once he came to Jesus. He had been called to be a church planter and a missionary. But it didn't come easily! And from Paul's ministry we learn that if we want to have a transformed ministry (one that is fruitful!) it's going to require that we have some endurance. That we won't give up when it's hard or difficult! It's only after endurance has happened that fruit appears! (you can read more about that in Acts 13,14)

4. Transformed by the resurrection – And then on Easter Sunday we studied Acts 7-9 to learn that when we are confronted with the resurrected Christ, a wonderful transformation takes place. For Paul, the resurrected Jesus transformed his plans, his priorities and his pride! All because of God's POWER!

We will continue to study the life of Paul and to learn lessons from him and his teachings on how God wants to transform each of us to be the men and women that God would have us be! See you Sunday!
