## REFLECTIONS FROM TUSCANY

I have not yet had time to really process our whole experience in Tuscany. And after travel for over 40+ hours with little sleep, I am not sure how much sense I will make. But I want to share two observations.

First, as we toured around the countryside, each little village was centered upon a church with a tower. Of course, when you get to the cities, you find the cathedrals with all the surroundings. I wonder what it would be like to live in a society where the church is the center – physically as well as spiritually. To have that at the center of each town was an obviously vital symbol of life.





Second was the Duomo (cathedral) in Pisa. We took a morning in Pisa. And while you cannot miss the infamous leaning tower, the cathedral for me was much more enthralling. It was begun in about 1060, and as it was built the styles changed, from the massive base to the lighter upper part of the sanctuary. And it is filled with carvings that tell the life of Christ and the story of the Bible to a people who could not read. In the Renaissance huge pictures were added along the aisles.

But the most fascinating to me was the new pulpit and altar that have just been added. They are controversial, for they do not seek to mimic the old, but are clearly pieces of contemporary art. But this is appropriate, for that is what happened across the centuries.

It is a metaphor for the faith. We have our solid foundation on what we have inherited from the church. But it is also a faith for the present, not an imitation of what was.


#### Candy Give-away, Wednesday, October 31, 4-7 p.m.

# How can I help those in need from the aftermath of Hurricane Florence?



This is a great question. Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is present and already at work in helping to get immediate aid to those impacted by Hurricane Florence on the eastern seaboard of the United States. Initial assessments suggested catastrophic destruction, but the full scope of the damage will not be known for many months.

The storm's path cut across areas still recovering from Hurri-

cane Matthew in 2016. While these winds and waters have meant loss and destruction, the work of PDA might become, as the Psalmist says, "a river whose streams make glad the city of God." PDA is deploying teams to affected presbyteries to meet with Presbyterian and community leadership to assist in coordinating relief efforts and mucking out homes and churches. After initial needs are addressed, PDA will remain—providing spiritual and emotional care and Long Term Recovery to address unmet needs of those impacted. Through your prayerful gifts we draw hope out of the chaos.
