#### SOME OF THE BACKGROUND

from Frank A.

In the five years prior to our arrival at Central, the annual giving decreased by \$285,000. There were no budget cuts to make up this difference, and the annual budget was running a deficit of \$100,000-\$150,000 each year, which came from our unrestricted endowment. The reasons for this deficit are many, some being people who had died or moved away, and others who left the church. This rate of a deficit was not sustainable.

#### **OUR PRESENT REALITY**

Over the last three years, the Finance Committee, the Session and all the leadership have worked diligently to close the deficit. We have sought to cut anything we could from budget —as long as the cuts did not affect ministry. We have done amazingly! Our deficit this year is only about one third of what it was four years ago. No one on staff has received a raise over the past four years, and one member of our staff went to volunteer status. We have saved on our cleaning staff.

The preliminary budget for 2019 has cut another \$10,000. But the challenge is also to increase our giving. The Evangelism Task Force is working on some ideas as well. We hope that you will consider this as you make your commitment for the new year. In the next week or so, you will receive the commitment card for 2019 in the mail. We ask that you PLEASE prayerfully consider being a part of the work and ministry of Central Presbyterian.

#### A SECOND MILE CHALLENGE

At the same time as we were working on the 2019 budget, we have the estimate to repair and replace the gutters (see page 3) for a cost of \$110,000. We have been approved for a loan for the immediate cost, and will have a three year campaign to pay it off. We are asking people to make a pledge in relation to a linear foot of guttering which is \$150. The ultimate challenge asks you to pledge a linear foot (\$150) a month for three years (\$5,400). There will be an additional commitment card in your mailing for this project.

## HAVE YOU LOOKED UP LATELY?

We have the legacy of a great building that we use in many ways for ministry. The sanctuary and education wing are almost seventy years old. And for at least forty of those years we have had problems with the enclosed gutters on that building.

From my architectural training, I know that water is the worst enemy for a building. Water can get into the structure and eventually rot out the heart of the building. And if you look up, you can see that we have water problems, not with the roof but with the gutters. Over the years, we have tried various ways to patch and hope it will go away. It is only getting worse, and the leadership knows that it is time to fix them correctly.

This will involve covering over the enclosed gutter system, and replacing it with an oversized external system. Along the way there is much wood that will need patching and replacing. [State Street UMC had the exact same system, the exact same problem, and has recently fixed it with the same solution and company.] This is an expensive repair, and of the five companies that were contacted, only one was even willing to give us an estimate for the work.

The cost is estimated at \$110,000 for the repair and replacement of 750 feet of gutters. This is about \$150 for a linear foot. [I know it sound expensive, and it is, but it is the right way to fix this problem.] We will be able to obtain a loan from the presbytery for ten years at 1.5% interest. And we will have a three—year second mile campaign to help us begin to pay this off.

On Reformation Sunday, we looked at how the church responded when the culture they lived in had radical changes. In the 1500s, the literary revolution changed how people operated in the world. The Protestant Reformation led the church to adapt to a new reality. We are the heirs of that reformation.

But we also know that the world we live in has changed rapidly over the last generation. Most people carry smart phones that are not only for making phone calls, but also connecting us to the larger world. It is our connection to the web that is binding the entire world together. From our phone, we can google a question, call up a YouTube video, order a takeout meal, make reservations in another state or country, and wish friends far and near a happy birthday.

The church is slowly coming into this new reality. Our church software is experiencing a major update. This new update is called REALM CONNECT, and offers us new ways to build the community of the church. Each member has a unique profile page. On that profile page, you can keep up with the church news, give changes to phone numbers or emails or addresses, get in contact with other members and the staff, update your own information, check out your giving record, and make reservations for activities.

An important part of this upgrade is the ability to easily give on-line. Through your profile or your phone app, you can give either one time or set up regular giving. You are also able to text a financial gift to the church. When it is totally operational, there will be the opportunity to pay for dinner or books, give to the second mile campaign or your commitment.

This is all a work in progress, and we are inviting you to come with us. There will be an introduction to Realm Connect at our Stewardship Presentation on Sunday, November 4. When you get an email asking you to join Realm, go ahead and join us. Then take some time to set up your profile page.
