- The report on Presbytery Meeting on November 8 at King University was received.

#### **ACTIONS OF THE SESSION**

- The Christmas Schedule was approved including the new Longest Night Service on Dec 20.

- The Trustees of Central Presbyterian Church were instructed to transfer the property and assets to the Central Presbyterian Church of Bristol, INC.

## THE LONGEST NIGHT ....

On Thursday, December 20, at 7:00 pm, we will have a Longest Night Service of Worship. This is an opportunity for all who find this season difficult or tiresome, who feel the losses in life, and need a place to pause and reflect.

So why have a Longest Night Service? The Christmas season is often marked by expressions of joy, excitement, and happiness. It's a time for family to gather and for churches to worship pointing to the hope that is found in the coming of the Christ child. However, this time of joy and expectation can often overshadow the pain and hurt many experience during this season, when the world's merriment puts their grief and sorrow in the shadows.

It's a worship service scheduled around the winter solstice (the longest night of the calendar year) and it just happens to fall on or around December 21 every year. It is noted that this day is the traditional feast day for Saint Thomas the Apostle. This linkage invites making some connections between Thomas's struggle to believe the tale of Jesus' resurrection, the long nights just before Christmas, and the struggle with darkness and grief faced by those living with loss.

This service is a witness to all, that the Christ child comes as a sign of hope in the face of despair. It is a way for our church family to acknowledge the various seasons of life that people may find themselves in. You are invited to come and leave behind for a moment the busyness of the season, to reflect and remember, and to see that the light of Christ does come into our darkness.

## **Upcoming Sermons**

We come into a new church year with Advent, a time of waiting with hope. The readings in Advent will come from the Gospel of Luke. Our Christmas Seasons lasts for twelve days, ending with Epiphany, the coming of the wise ones who followed the light.
