THE LONGEST NIGHT

On **Thursday, December 20, at 7:00 pm**, we will have a Longest Night Service of Worship. This is an opportunity for all who find this season difficult or tiresome, who feel the losses in life, and need a place to pause and reflect.

So why have a Longest Night Service? The Christmas season is often marked by expressions of joy, excitement, and happiness. It's a time for family to gather and for churches to worship pointing to the hope that is found in the coming of the Christ child. However, this time of joy and expectation can often overshadow the pain and hurt many experience during this season, when the world's merriment puts their grief and sorrow in the shadows.

It's a worship service scheduled around the winter solstice (the longest night of the calendar year) and it falls on or around December 21 every year. It is noted that this day is the traditional feast day for Saint Thomas the Apostle. This linkage invites making some connections between Thomas's struggle to believe the tale of Jesus' resurrection, the long nights just before Christmas, and the struggle with darkness and grief faced by those living with loss.

This service is a witness to all that the Christ child comes as a sign of hope in the face of despair. It is a way for our church family to acknowledge the various seasons of life that people may find themselves in. You are invited to come and leave behind for a moment the busyness of the season, to reflect and remember, and to see that the light of Christ does come into our darkness.

The Board of Directors has analyzed and worked on fixing our issues, and has hired Shatona Williams as a Case Manager. She is already hard at work engaging with families in our community. Central Presbyterian Church will have the first week to host families. We hope you will be a part of this very power-

ful ministry. We are scheduled to receive our families on Sunday, January 6 at 5 p.m. and they will reside at night in our church building.

Soon Mary Wampler will be making calls to ask people to help with providing dinners, eating with and visiting with the families, as well as staying overnight here in the church. Several people can join up to do this together and to make a difference in the people's lives.

This past August, the PC(USA) celebrated the life and ministry of the Reverend Dr. Katie Cannon, a gifted leader and the first African American woman ordained in the United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A. Dr. Cannon was a graduate of Barber Scotia College and, at the time of her death, she was the Annie Scales Rogers Professor of Christian Social Ethics at Union Presbyterian Seminary in Richmond, Virginia. A renowned lecturer and the author of seven books, Dr. Cannon received the Award for Excellence in Theological Education in June of this year at the 223rd General Assembly (2018) in St. Louis. Her gifts of teaching, mentoring, and advocacy for women, especially women of color, helped develop leaders for ministry.

Don't know how to do a project? That is the best part. You will work alongside of those who can help you to be a part of this.

Then at 11:00, we will bring our projects as a gift for our worship time, offer our prayers over the items and for those who will receive them. In the afternoon, those who want to go to the Food Pantry to restock shelves, will go together, while others may go out to visit our homebound members.
