The coaches are Niki McGrew for the 9 a.m. service and Whit Morison at the 11 a.m., and everyone should expect to hear pep-talks and words of encouragement to be a part of this event. Don't be surprised if you see cheerleaders.

Last year we collected \$2,107 & 2,079 food items. So the question is: Can we break this record this year!!



There will be Food Pantry Barrels and blue buckets for your monetary gifts at the entry area to both services. Throughout January, the scores will be kept and posted. Then on Sunday, February 3 (Souper Bowl Sunday), we will have a unity service at 11 a.m. in the Sanctuary for one last push for collections. Following worship, we will gather for a Soup lunch in Central Hall. Everyone is invited to bring your favorite soup, or bread or dessert to share. At this time, the official score will be posted and the winner declared.

Though the competition will be within our church, the real winner will be **Bristol Emergency Food Pantry**. This is something every one of every age and ability can participate in. Let's make a difference, and continue to be about the work of Christmas (caring for the needy, feeding the hungry, welcoming the stranger and unwanted child).
