January Souper Bowl of Caring Food Collection Challenge

The January collection is off to a great start. But we still have a long way to go. Everyone is invited to get in the game and to bring in food items (see below) or donate money; all to help the Bristol Emergency Food Pantry. The competition will be between the two worship services: 9 vs 11. Each week we will hear words of encouragement to be a part of this event from our coaches (Niki McGrew for the 9 a.m. service and Whit Morison at the 11 a.m.).

Donnie Spurell put out a challenge for us to double last year's collection and bring in 4,000 food items. Remember you can get great prices on canned goods when there are the "Buy One/Get One" sales as well as good deals at Aldi or Priceless stores.

There are Food Pantry barrels and plastic buckets for your monetary gifts in the entry area. Each is marked for a particular worship group. Throughout January, the scores will be kept and posted on the bulletin board outside Ann Aichinger's office. We will continue this challenge through Sunday, February 3 (Souper Bowl Sunday), when we will worship together at 11 and then share in a soup lunch. Sign up to bring a pot of soup, bread or crackers, or dessert to share.

Though the competition will be within our church, the real winner will be Bristol Emergency Food pantry. This is something every one of every age and ability can participate in. Let's make a difference, and continue to be about the work of Christmas (caring for the needy, feeding the hungry, welcoming the stranger and unwanted child).





Items needed: (no glass jars or containers)

- Meal kits that don't require extra ingredients
- Pancake and muffin mix that only require water
- Canned soups
- Canned pasta meals (ravioli, spaghetti)
- Canned meat (tuna, ham, chicken, beef stew, spam)
- Canned vegetables (no green beans are needed)
- Canned pork and beans
- Canned fruit (no fruit cups)
- Dry Rice
- Pasta
- Instant mashed potatoes (plain or flavored, made with water is best)

- Spaghetti sauce (no glass jars)
- Cereal (hot and cold)
- Jelly and Peanut butter
- Breakfast bars/granola bars
- Macaroni and cheese (preferably not needing milk or butter)
- Pantry staples (small containers of flour, salt and pepper, sugar, catsup, oil, etc.)

Appalachian Mountain Religion and The Bristol Sessions

The 1927 Bristol Sessions famously launched the careers of Country Music's earliest stars. They also captured a wide variety of Appalachian worship music styles. This three week series looks at the lives and ministries of Bristol Session artists Ernest Phipps and Alfred Karnes, considers the commonalities and peculiarities of Appalachian Mountain Religion, and describes one of the first meetings of Christian evangelism and twentieth-century mass media. Brandon is the Professor of English at King University (and son of Kathy Story).

Recycling Opportunities at Central Presbyterian Church

Central offers a variety of ways for helping people and for recycling your used items:

- Aluminum Cans There is a new spot for the can recycling. The big blue bin is under the canopy area, be-٠ hind the beautiful Tadlock sculpture. The cans are sold at the recycling center and the proceeds go to help Habitat for Humanity.
- Cell phones These are given to either Abuse Alternatives or the Bristol VA Police Senior Resource Center ٠ to use as 911 phones. There is a container in the church office.
- **Box Tops for Education** Save those "box tops" to help the schools. Place in container in the church office. ٠
- Printer/Toner Cartridges Bring any type of these and place them in the brown bin at the end of the office ٠ hallway. The proceeds from recycling these go to Bristol Faith in Action.
- Eyeglasses and hearing aids We collect all eyeglasses and hearing aids for donation to the local Lions ٠ Club. The members send them to be re-fitted for people who are unable to afford these vital items, here and abroad. There is a box in the brown bin for these.
- Sewing supplies and fabric that you might no longer need are wanted for the Little Girls Dresses and Little ٠ Boys Shirts and Britches that are sent overseas, and for Stuffed Animals that are sent overseas to give to children who are receiving their vaccinations. Place these in the brown bin in the hallway.
- **Used postage stamps** we are still saving these although this program may soon be ending. The container ٠ is in the church office. Commemoratives and large stamps are needed—no small or flag stamps.
- Used 100% cotton towels these are used to make peri-pads for teenage girls overseas.
