Canoeing the Mountains---Part 4

This is the fourth part to my writings about the book, Canoeing the Mountains by Tod Bolsinger and Lewis and Clark's expedition to find a waterway to the west coast. As you will remember, with their orders from President Jefferson, they were convinced that the Missouri River flowed to the Pacific Ocean. But as they came to the head waters of that river, and carrying their canoes over the next mountain, they saw the "horrible mountains" of the Rockies. They chose to move forward and as a result, learned new ways for survival. They chose to adapt to their circumstances, and in doing so, the leadership they offered the expedition gives us a better insight into what leading and living was then, and how it applies to us in this new time.

The key to the success of Lewis and Clark's expedition in this adventure was that they chose to go together with an incredible team of assistants and members of the Corps of Discovery. Yet even as they continued forward, members of the exploration party were not so sure that this was the right way to go. Unfortunately, there were those on the team who sought to sabotage the mission and made it clear that the best thing to do was to return home. But for Lewis and Clark that was NOT the plan. They proceeded on even in the face of disruptions and the questions raised about the practicality of the journey.

Throughout history there have been those who have had a "big idea" and did survive in spite of those who sought to sabotage their mission. They knew it was the right thing to do and continued on even when faced with hardship and criticism. One example was when President John F. Kennedy offered a big, bold vision of getting to the moon. Yes, he had NASA, but this was truly a giant leap to do something never done before. There had been several attempts and many failures, but there was a desire to keep moving forward. On July 20, 1969, Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin took those famous steps on the moon's surface. They had kept true to the mission and vision, and that vision was there for all to see.

Even Jesus lived into a big and bold vision of proclaiming that God is at hand and doing something new. The religious leaders did not like having their way of life disrupted by this itinerant preacher, but Jesus and his followers kept moving forward together, calmly and courageously. Even as Jesus demonstrated the deep compassion to care for people, he also challenged the status quo by offering a new way to Life. Jesus' work and ministry demonstrated God's love and has led to a new understanding of who God is, and how God is at work.

As a church, we entered unchartered territory because of all that we have experienced and learned in these last 15 months. Without a lot of people engaged in the learning process and seeking a new life within the new ways of being a church, we could not be making the progress we are. However, we are still in unchartered territory. There are still questions and considerations for our future that the Session will continue to wrestle with. But the main thing is that we need to go together. Everyone together, even those who are uncertain about what is happening.

I invite you to continue to pray for the leadership of the church as we seek to discern the working of God in our midst, and as we seek to follow Christ into this unknown. Pray also for one another so that we might travel together, calmly and courageously, living to serve Christ in new ways in this new world. I still do not know what the future holds, but I know who holds the future. I am still not sure where we are going, but I do trust God's guidance for us as we go. So come along and join our journey. Ask questions and offer encouragement. Pray and keep watch. For God is leading us into a new place.

At this time, the CPC Session maintains that we are to continue to wear masks when gathering inside as a group. Session will revisit these guidelines (below) at the June stated meeting, and we will inform you of any changes in action.

Remember...the wearing of masks and social distancing is one visible way that we can care for one another and show our love as a community of faith. For those of you who have the greatest threat from the COVID virus, you need to know that we are seeking real ways to care for you. Please consider how all of you can do your part within the community of faith here at Central while continuing to show your love for one another.

With some of the restrictions being eased, we do invite you to wear your colored bracelets (or pick yours up at the church.) Of course, this is still a fluid situation, and we do not want to pressure anyone into a place of feeling uncomfortable.

- The BLUE bracelets still indicates that you are vaccinated, and if you have not been vaccinated, we hope that you will make a plan to be vaccinated against COVID-19.
- Since the restrictions have changed in Virginia as far as physical contact is concerned, the GREEN bracelet will now indicate that you are okay with hugs or handshakes.
- YELLOW bracelets now indicate that you favor fist bumps or elbow bumps as the physical contact.
- The RED bracelets indicate that you desire to maintain no physical contact at this time.


