## Session News...

The session met on Tuesday, June 15 by Zoom.

- Kim Profitt was received into membership of Central, and welcomed on Sunday, June 20.
- We examined the elders for the class of 2024. All were approved and welcomed as part of the Session.
- Ann Aichinger gave her pastors report which included information about her upcoming vacation to New England (August 18-30.) She and Barbara Mann will be traveling together. Ann will drop off the Session books from 1975-2005 at the PCUSA Historical Society in Philadelphia. She will also be participating in Creative Arts/Fall Craft week Conference at Montreat Conference Center on September 26-October 1. She will also be leading a workshop as a part of the Abingdon Presbytery Mountaintop Leadership day on Saturday, October 16 at Royal Oak Presbyterian Church in Marion, VA.
- Abingdon Presbytery will meet on July 8, 2021 at Sinking Spring Presbyterian Church, Abingdon, VA. John Dodge will be the representative to this meeting with John Barker as alternate. At this meeting, the new Presbytery leader, Rev. Ann Elyse Van Winkle. She will be preaching as well as being received into the Presbytery with a reception to follow.
- We approved the transfer of membership of Donna Leonard to State Street United Methodist Church.
- There were several committees that had written reports and actions taken:
- Administration and Staff committee recommended the following slate as officers for the Corporation:

- Care and Concern Committee continues to check in on people in our church family
- Evangelism Committee is maintaining the church website and posting information on Facebook.
- Fellowship and Dining will begin hosting coffee in the church kitchen on Sundays when worship is in Central Hall, and Lemonade in the Shade on Sundays when worship is in the Sanctuary.
- Mission and Outreach Committee brought to Session the Christmas in July project which is in partnership with Communities in Schools of Bristol, VA Public Schools. (See more information in this newsletter.)
- Property and Maintenance Committee submitted a written report about the bids received on having new vinyl windows installed in the education part of the building, and painting and repairing the shutters and window areas.
- Worship Committee recommended to continue to remain status quo with the guidelines for responding to Covid-19. A substitute motion was made and approved with the following guidelines:
  - Those vaccinated can exercise their best judgment about wearing face coverings.
  - Those not fully vaccinated should wear face coverings at all times when inside.
  - If you choose to wear a mask or if you choose not to wear a mask, there's no shame or judgment.
  - The colored bracelets are still available to help with indicating the level of physical contact that you may desire: <u>GREEN</u> indicates hugs and handshakes are acceptable; <u>YELLOW</u> indicates that fist bumps or elbow bumps are desired and <u>RED</u> is to request no physical contact at all.

The next meeting will be on Tuesday, July 20 at 7:00 p.m. in hybrid form both in-person and by Zoom.

## Christmas in July

We will be participating in the Christmas in July project through Communities in Schools with the Bristol, VA public schools. This is an opportunity for us to provide new clothes for those children of our community as they begin the new school year. There are two ways you can be a part:

1. **SHOP FOR STUDENTS:** Pick up a form from the table in the entry area and it will indicate the child's sizes, style, and color preferences so "adopters" can then shop for the student for the following items:

2 tops, 2 pairs of pants or shorts with elastic waist, 1 pack of socks, 1 pack of underwear

After shopping is complete, the items can be placed in one large bag per student with the shopping form attached to the bag, and return the bag to the church office by **Sunday**, **July 18**.

2. SPONSOR A STUDENT: Sponsor a student by making a monetary donation of \$75. High school students will be taken shopping to purchase their own school clothes. This allows CIS to meet the students' needs, ensuring that they get exactly what they need.

**Donations** can be made rough their website: <u>www.cisofswva.org/donations/christmasinjuly</u>, or by donating to Central with *Christmas in July* in the memo line. All donors are asked to spend approximately \$50 - \$75 for each student sponsored. By placing a spending limit on each child, we can ensure that ALL children in the home receive a comparable amount of items.
