Reflections From a Rocking Chair

On the northeast side of Jamaica, there is a house that is crumbling into the ocean, called Folly's Ruin. Built in the early 1900s by a wealthy American for his bride-to-be. The home overlooked a beautiful cove with crystal blue waters. It was an expensive project in an isolated area of Jamaica. The legend is that corners were cut in its construction including adding saltwater to the concrete which may have led to the crumbling of the house in less than 12 years after completion. But it still stands there on Folly's Point near Port Antonio, crumbling into ruins.

As Christians, we seek to build upon solid foundations with strong structures for the future of the church. But our foundations are not made of stone and plaster and paint. Instead, our foundations are built upon Scripture and study, worship and praise, and service and caring for those in our midst. Our foundations are built upon the words and life of Jesus Christ, who is the cornerstone of our building.

At Central, we have a history of 146 years of ministry and mission here in Bristol, VA. But, really, our history goes back 2000 years to the early church of Jesus, and is built upon all those who have gone before us. This includes the many churches and individuals who have been mentioned in history books, those who lived by faith, and those who dared to step out in faith to do something new.

This year, our Stewardship theme is **Firm Foundations for the Future**. We are laying the foundations in 2021 for our ministry and mission over the next 20 years. Today, we are living in the decisions that were made in 2001. So when we think about foundations, we need to understand that we are working on the foundations for the future at Central.

Thank you to all who have continued to give faithfully to the mission of Central. With your faithfulness, our finances are stable, and that is because of you. You have also been flexible in this interesting time that we are living in. COVID has changed so much of our lives, especially our church life as we have had to pivot as needs changed. Yet, through this time, we have been able to reconcile the endowment fund and have been able to achieve a solid footing so that our investments are working to help us live into the mission that Christ calls us.

We want to pay off the loan we took from the Tynes Fund through the Presbytery to pay for the gutter campaign. Fixing the gutters stopped the leaks that were impacting the walls of the Sanctuary and the entry areas as well as adding wear and tear to the building. We ask that if you have made a pledge in this campaign, that you plan to pay off your pledge by December 31, 2021. Our next major project is to replace the windows in the education portion of the building. The glazing is chipping, some of the panes are broken, and the wood frames are rotting. But, because of faithfulness in giving, we see the opportunity to be able to have them repaired in Spring, 2022.

Central is a huge building and we are using it consistently. APPLE Academy is in the building Monday through Friday with classes for children up to 5 years old. We also have groups that use our building throughout the week for meetings and gatherings. Plus, our own church life is slowly returning to the building with youth group meetings, committee meetings, and classes gathering on Sundays. Our building is one of our firm foundations that allow us to meet the needs of our community.

The building is not our only foundation for our life here at Central. You, our members and friends, are our strongest foundation, and it is upon you that we seek to build as we move faithfully into the future. I ask that you begin praying as to how God is calling you to support the work and ministry of Central as we enter into 2022. Our commitment Sunday will be November 14, and we hope that you and your family will help to continue to build upon our firm foundations for the future.



The session met on Tuesday, October 19, 2021 by Zoom. The following were actions taken:

- Christmas bonuses for the staff, as well as a proposed salary increase of 2.5% for 2022;
- The APPLE Staff to have a Friends-Giving dinner and fellowship time on Tuesday, November 16, 2021 at the church from 6:15-7:30 p.m.;
- APPLE Preschool will have a Food Drive November 1-17 as a part of their emphasis on thanksgiving, ٠ and helping to connect the children with those in need in our community. The food will be donated to Bristol Emergency Food pantry;
- We host a Trick-or-Treat event on Sunday, October 31, 4:30-7:00 p.m. on Euclid Ave;
- There will be a Parents Night Out on Friday, December 3 as a fundraiser for the youth; ٠
- There will be an Advent activity day on Sunday, November 28 from 3:00-5:00 p.m.;
- The High School Youth are registered for Youth 1, June 1-5, 2022 at Montreat, and several of our college ٠ students are going to the Montreat Collegiate Conference January 2-5, 2022. Ann Aichinger and Josie Russell will be chaperoning these events;
- There will be posters for the holiday and seasonal events. Also, approved was a fundraiser for selling of ٠ the miniature Nativities with a variety of styles available;
- Evangelism Committee will host an after-worship lunch "meet up" at a local restaurant monthly;
- It was approved that our church would be a partner to support the Wild Goose Worshiping Community (in Floyd County) with \$100/month in 2022 as a part of our benevolences. Also, individuals (especially those who have been a part of this ministry since 2012) are invited and encouraged to consider being partners with a sponsorship of \$20/month or more;
- Worship committee recommended that we resume in-person worship on Sunday, October 24 at 10:00 ٠ a.m. in Central Hall and alternating between Central Hall and Sanctuary. All of the COVID guidelines of wearing masks and social distancing will be observed.
